2. Hot Weather Uniform – All – Information

We apologise for confusion that has arisen about hot weather guidance this week. Please read the following as the definitive guide:

School will send notify parents when prolonged hot weather is likely i.e. above 20°C. We will notify by schoolsbuddy, tweet and the next weekly communication. We will call the period ‘Hot Weather Uniform’

During this period,

- it will be entirely parental choice to select the most appropriate uniform for their child on the day, usually PE kit
- children, if in normal school uniform, should not attend school with a tie and should not attend with a school jumper or leavers hoodie, shirt should have top button undone and finally – shirts can be untucked!

We will also communicate when this comes to an end – tweeting and schools buddy

We can confirm that ‘Hot Weather Uniform’ will last for the remainder of the week. The weather forecast for next week looks significantly cooler. We are also quite relaxed about this and would ask all parents to approach this in a similarly relaxed way and make common sense decisions in the knowledge that no child will ever be in trouble for short term adjustment to uniform or genuine misunderstanding.
