
Why might some be written in red?

What is an adverb?


Adverbs give us more information about a verb, explaining how, when, where or why an action is taking place.

"Quick! Mammoth heading this way!" shouted Om.






Add them after you know who has spoken to let the reader know how the character's tone of voice would have sounded.




