WALT Convert nouns into verbs using suffixes

adding -ate, -ise, -ify

Adding -ate, -ise, or -ify

Most root words do not change and **-ate**, **-ise** or **-ify** are added to the end without changing the spelling, e.g. carbon becomes carbonate; capital becomes capitalise; test becomes testify. However, if the root word ends in an 'e' or a 'y', remove the 'e' or the 'y' and add **-ate**, **-ise** or **-ify**, e.g. fortune becomes fortunate; accessory becomes accessorise; intense becomes intensify.

carbon + ate = carbonate

capital + ise = capitalise

test + ify = testify

fortune - e + ate = fortunate

accessory - y + ise = accessorise

Some synonyms are stronger than others -
we can call these Shades of Meaning

✕ happy	sad
glad	cheerless
delighted	melancholy
elated	sorrowful
overjoyed	distressed
ecstatic	heartbroken

These words are stronger

Julie was ecstatic to discover that she was going to the circus.

Peter was happy to discover that he was going to the circus

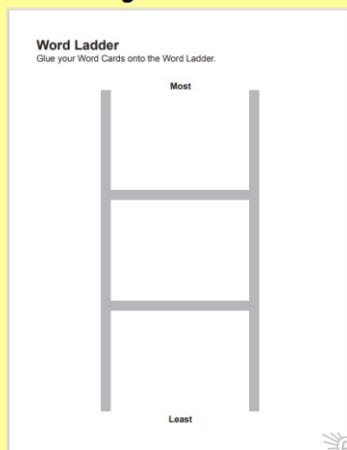
