WALT Convert nouns into verbs using suffixes

adding -ate, -ise, -ify

Adding -ate, -ise, or -ify

Most root words do not change and **-ate**, **-ise** or **-ify** are added to the end without changing the spelling, e.g. carbon becomes carbonate; capital becomes capitalise; test becomes testify. However, if the root word ends in an 'e' or a 'y', remove the 'e' or the 'y' and add **-ate**, **-ise** or **-ify**, e.g. fortune becomes fortunate; accessory becomes accesorise; intense becomes intensify.

carbon + ate = carbonate capital + ise = capitalise test + ify = testify

fortune - e + ate = fortunate accessory - y + ise = accessorise


