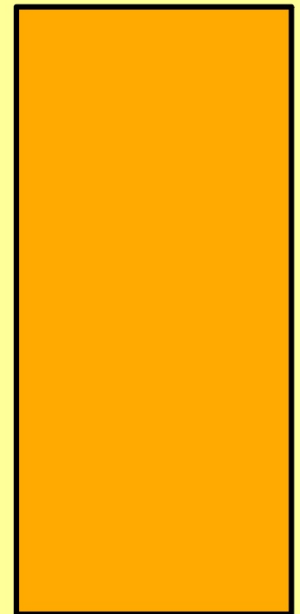

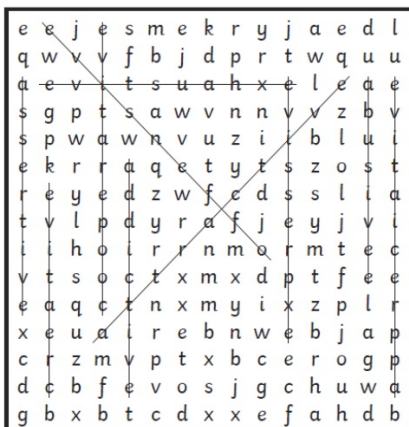

To enable us to write a poem showing emotion, we need to explore feelings and words/actions we associate with them.



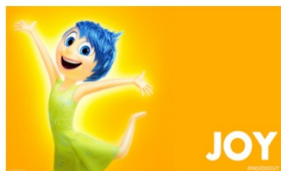
In Disney/Pixar's Inside Out, we meet the characters of Joy and Sadness.

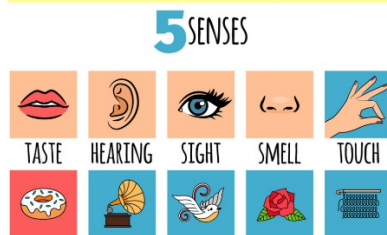

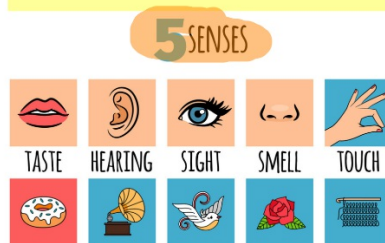

On her first day of school, Jane was as cool as a cucumber.




