Synonym Same Meaning		Antonym Opposite Meaning	
small		little	→ big 
happy		joyful	→ sad 
woman		lady	→ man 
cold		chilly	→ hot 
fast		swift	→ slow 
sick		ill	→ healthy 
wet		soaked	→ dry 

What is an antonym?

It is a word with the opposite meaning to another word

Poetry Success Criteria				SA	PA
Structure					
			Organise your poem into stanzas (verses)		
			Read your poem out loud to ensure you have rhythm		
			Rhyme – can you use sensible rhyming couplets or ABAB rhyme		
Language					
			Use a simile (as, like)		
			Use a metaphor (is)		
			Include the senses (taste, smell, hearing, touch and sight)		
			Imagery – use show not tell to engage your reader		
			Personification (give human qualities)
