

What is a relative clause?

A relative clause can be used to give additional information about a noun.

What are the relative pronouns?

who, when, where, which, that, whose



These are called 'relative pronouns'. They can be used to add extra information to a sentence.

John, who is six, loves riding his dad's tractor.



This gives us more information about John.

It doesn't make sense on its own.

It is a type of subordinate clause called a relative clause.

It must begin with a relative pronoun.
