

NASTY WRITING!

We can use adverbs to modify our sentence to show the possibility of something happening.

For example; surely, definitely, possibly, perhaps

He woke with a start and sat up.
Outside it was light. it was late
morning **perhaps**, or early
afternoon.

We can also use a modal verb to modify our sentence to show the possibility of something happening.

For example; might, can, shall, may, must

What was in the drawer included things that **might** be mended one day.

NASTY WRITING!

Example: We will *possibly* go on holiday next year.
I *might* go to the party later.

Modify this sentence with an adverb to indicate a degree of possibility.

It won't rain tonight.

It definitely won't rain tonight.

For example; surely, definitely, possibly, perhaps
