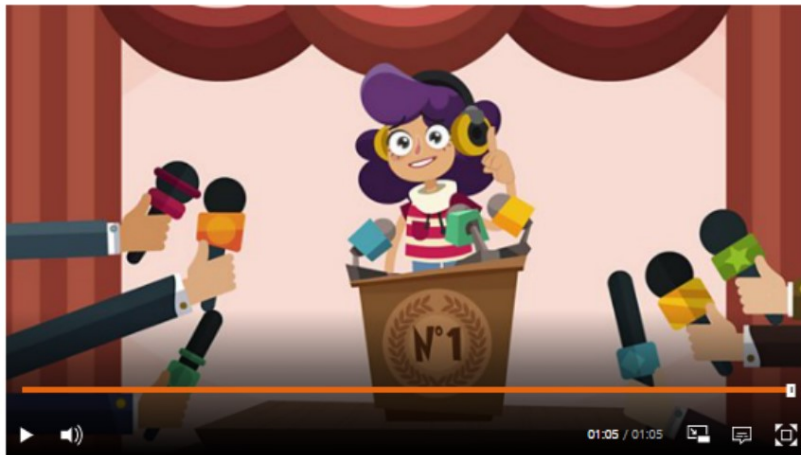

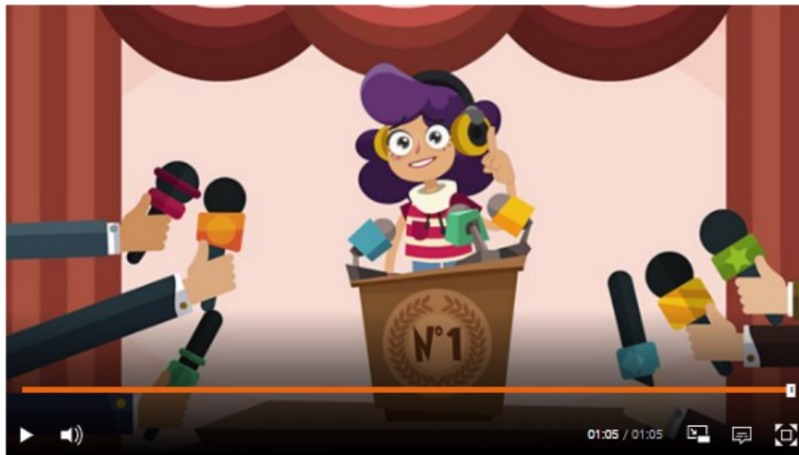



- Malala Yousafzai
- 1997, 12th July born Swat Valley, Mingora, Pakistan
- 2007, Taliban terrorist group took control of Swat Valley
- Taliban - stop education for girls
- She spoke out for the right for girls to go to school -using a blog.
- October 9th 2012 (15yrs old) was shot by Taliban on way home
- 2014 - youngest person get Nobel Peace Prize / speak to United Nations
- Now lives in Birmingham, UK - too dangerous to go home
- Enjoys normal life - cricket, badminton
