Council Tax

A payment every household must make to their local council to cover the cost of local services. These services include things like libraries, the police, fire service, rubbish collection, street cleaning and parks.

Every house receives an annual council tax bill which can be paid monthly.

Utilities

These include gas and electricity (energy), and water. Energy is used for lighting, cooking and heating. Water includes clean drinking water and a sewer connection for waste water. The amount you pay will vary depending on how much you use and which company provides the services.

TV Licence

You must have a TV licence if you watch or record programmes on a television or live on websites, like the BBC, which could be accessed on any device like a desktop computer, a laptop, a mobile phone, a tablet or a games console.

TV/Internet packages

These allow you to access the Internet in your home (from any device), and to watch a whole range of channels on your TV.

Basic food/household items

These include staple foods like bread, milk, meat, fish, fruit and vegetables and items used regularly in the home like laundry detergent, cleaning products and toilet rolls.

Basic clothes

These include clothes to wear to school or work, coats for cold weather and shoes etc.

Not absolutely necessary - things we want but don't necessarily need.


