

Rhetorical questions

Rhetorical questions are questions that don't need an answer or have a really obvious answer!

This question needs an answer: "Why haven't you done your homework?"

This question doesn't expect an answer: "Do you know what happened to me yesterday?"

Rhetorical questions are often used to emphasise a particular point or to engage the reader more with the writing.

Write 3-4 rhetorical questions beginning with the question starters in the list below – or you could create some of your own. Write questions you could use in your persuasive writing this week. <u>Challenge</u>: write your rhetorical question and then, go on to answer it for the reader!
