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Super-Safe – Washing Hands

- Washing your hands regularly is one of the best ways to keep everyone super-safe.
- We will all wash or sanitise our hands
 - Entering the classroom in the morning
 - Before break
 - After break
 - Before lunch
 - After lunch
 - AND whenever you use the toilet / cough or sneeze
 - **NEW – after stroking Gryff the school dog!**

Super-Safe - Social Distancing

- Another great way to keep safe is to follow social distancing rules – that is to do our best to keep at least 1m (preferably 2m) away from each other wherever possible. The only exception is in the classroom where this will not be possible – however, we will be doing other things to keep us as safe as possible there.
- Social distancing is important
 - Arriving at school
 - At break and lunch times on the playground
 - Moving around school
 - Leaving at the end of the day











- As you may be using different gates to normal (this will be explained later), the next slide shows you where to cross roads safely.




Road Safety – Where to Cross Roads

There is a crossing outside the front of Chesswood School




What will school be like?

What do I wear?

- We would like you to wear your school uniform
 - Grey trousers / shorts / skirt / dress
 - Blue shirt or blouse
 - Tie
 - School jumper or cardigan
 - Grey socks / grey or red tights
 - Black shoes
- But don't worry if you have some items missing – it will take a bit of time to get back to full uniform – just do your best
- Please make sure you have a suitable coat if it is cold or wet



On PE days

- You will need to wear your PE kit to school on days that you have PE for the foreseeable future as we won't be able to swap rooms to change
 - If the weather is cold, you can wear suitable tracksuit bottoms / sweatshirt

What is my new bubble?

- In early autumn term, we had bubbles of 3 classes – linked to afternoon PE.
- In November, we changed to smaller class only bubbles.
- In spring term, the children who were in may have been in mixed class bubbles.
- Now we are in new bubbles – again linked to afternoon PE, but the classes may have changed slightly.
- The idea of a bubble is that we try not to mix with other bubbles.
 - Stick to your play and lunch zones.
 - Be extra careful in maintaining social distance.

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What do I do when I arrive?

- On arrival, you will **go straight to your allocated zone** – see the next slide. At this time, you will remain in individual class bubbles.
- **Year 3** you will enter through the school car park – there will be no cars moving at the time this temporary entrance is open to children. Your parents will drop you off here and there will be lots of adults to help you find where to go.
- **Year 4-6** you may use the entrance at Chesswood Road or Ladydell Road - whatever is most convenient to you.

Entering the classroom

- When it is time to go in to school, a whistle will be blown and each class will be sent in separately
- You will be walked to your classroom – using the external doors wherever possible (all classrooms apart from those upstairs)
- Your teacher will organise you as a class –
 - Bags in lockers – take pencil case and snack to your desk (you cannot use your lockers at break)
 - Wash hands
 - Sit in your seat ready to learn


What will my classroom be like?



- Your classroom will be the same as the autumn term
 - Desks will be in rows – this is just an extra little thing to keep us safe
 - You will have your own place to sit at and there will be less movement around the classroom than usual
 - **New – you may get 2 different places to sit in class**
 - You will need to keep your resources on your desk and not share them with anyone – pen / pencil / ruler etc
 - There will be a teacher zone marked on the floor – you mustn't enter this
 - Classrooms will still be bright and exciting places to be

What will my timetable be like?

- You will have most of the usual lessons that you are used to in school
- We will continue with a little extra maths and English to help us all get up to speed – this will include lots of games and fun activities
- PE will be taken by Mr Quick and Mr Haggart
- Music will be taken by Mrs Cossins
- We will try and get some of our lessons outside so we can move around more





What if I can't come in to school?

- Some children will still have to isolate, if they have come into contact with COVID-19. **Isolation learning!**
- You will be expected to learn from home unless you are too ill to do so – you all need to know how to do this.

What will playtimes be like?


- Breaks will be staggered – only half of the school will be outside at any one time.
- You will go to your special zoned area for playtime – **use the safe paths and maintain distance from other people.**
- Your zone will be shared with a couple of other classes so you will get a chance to see and play with other friends
- Stop when you hear the whistle and only walk back to class when asked to do so (shown your card)



- Play the games you were taught in the autumn term to still keep over 1m apart


Where will my play-zone be?



Going to the toilet



Moving around school

- There will be minimal movement around school as you will use external doors to the playgrounds
- Follow the one way system – where it exists
- Use the lines to keep 2m apart
- All doors will be kept open with door stops to minimise surfaces we have to touch
- Do not go past any 'no entry' signs



Moving around school - Stairs

- There should only be one group of children using the stairs at one time (only Year 6)
- When the first child gets to the stairs, check to see if another class is coming in the other direction
 - if they are, then give way to them
 - If the stairs are empty, then proceed



End of the day

- **Year 3** – You will be collected from outside your classrooms by an adult or older sibling
- **Year 4** – You will be collected from the front playground by an adult or older sibling
- **Year 5 and 6** – You will leave school via the gate at the end of the field (Ladydell Rd) unless you are collecting a younger sibling. If you are collected by an adult, they will meet you at the gate or another arranged place
