WALT: spell words with suffixes

What is a root word?



A root word is the smallest part of a word which is what the word starts off as.

WALT: spell words with suffixes What is a suffix?

A group of letters that are added to the end of a word to change its meaning.





How does the meaning of the word change when a suffix is added?

If a suffix **starts with** a consonant letter, it is usually added straight on without changing the root word.

+ment

+ness

+ful

Look at these spellings and decide if they follow this rule or not. Let's check! Click on each word.

enjoyment
Yes! The suffix is added straight on to the root word: enjoy+ment

sadness
Yes! The suffix is added straight on to the root word: sad+ness

careful
Yes! The suffix is added straight on to the root word: care+ful

playful
Yes! The suffix is added straight on to the root word: play+ful

plainness
Yes! The suffix is added straight on to the root word: play+ful

There is an exception to this rule.




To add **-ment** to the word 'argue', you must remove the 'e' before adding the suffix.

argue + ment → argument → argument

Look carefully at these spellings. The root words all have more than one syllable and end in a $-{\bf y}$ with a consonant before it.




