What is a *clause*?

Recap!

clause

A group of words that contain a *verb*.

verb

Describes an action or feeling.

sleep



love

shout

teach

hear



sneeze

run

feel

What can a *main clause* do that a *subordinate clause* cannot?

main clause

Can stand alone as a sentence.

We *went* back to work.

subordinate clause

Can't stand alone as a sentence.

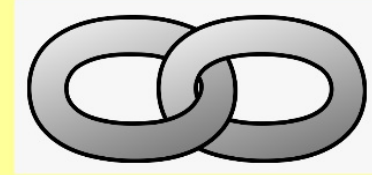
after we *ate* lunch

What do conjunctions do?

conjunctions

Joins two clauses together.



What type of clauses do co-ordinating conjunctions join?

co-ordinating conjunctions

Joins two main clauses together.

I like drawing but I prefer writing.

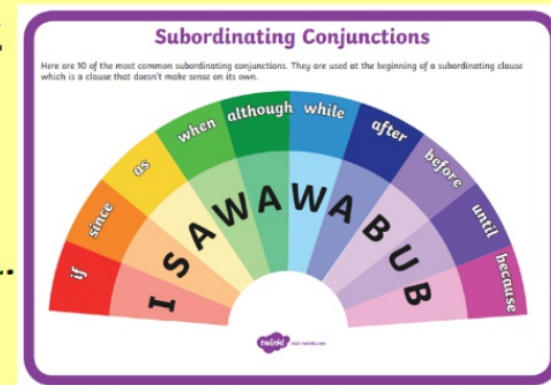


What type of clauses do subordinating conjunctions join?

subordinating conjunctions

Joins a main clause and a subordinate clause together.

We went back to work after we ate lunch.



Let's use conjunctions to finish these clauses together...

Use a co-ordinating conjunction to join
two main clauses together.

You need this car

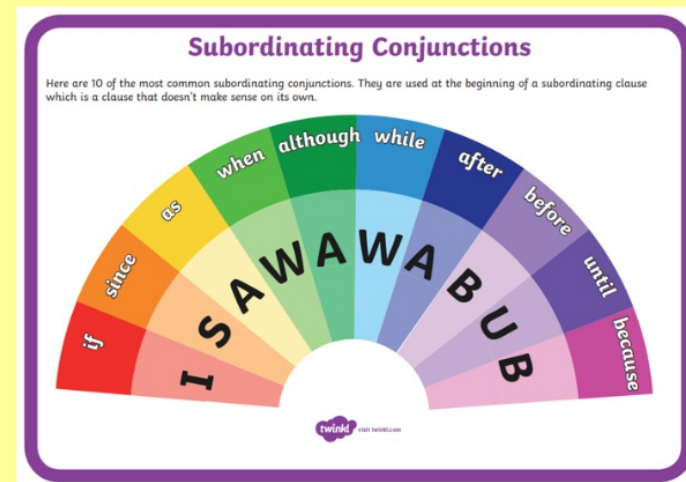
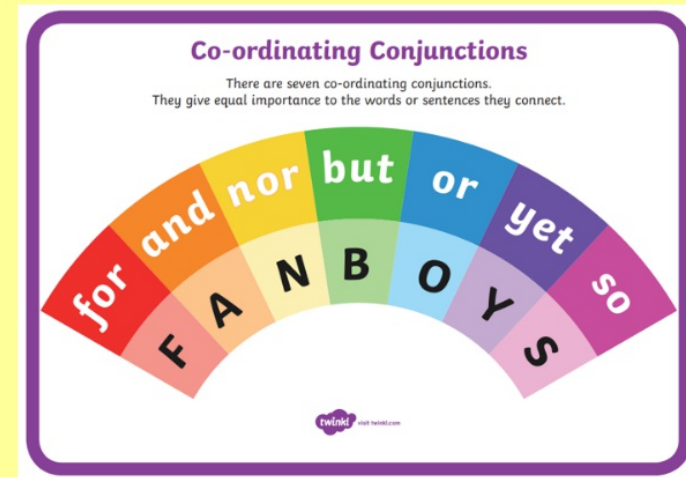
Use a subordinating conjunction to join a
main clause and a *subordinate clause*
together. Let's put our subordinate clause
at the start of the sentence!

My turn

you will be the coolest kid around!

Our turn

you won't regret it!

Use subordinating conjunctions to join clauses

Examples You need a new phone *because* it's so much faster than your old one!

If you buy this pencil case, everyone will think you're cool!

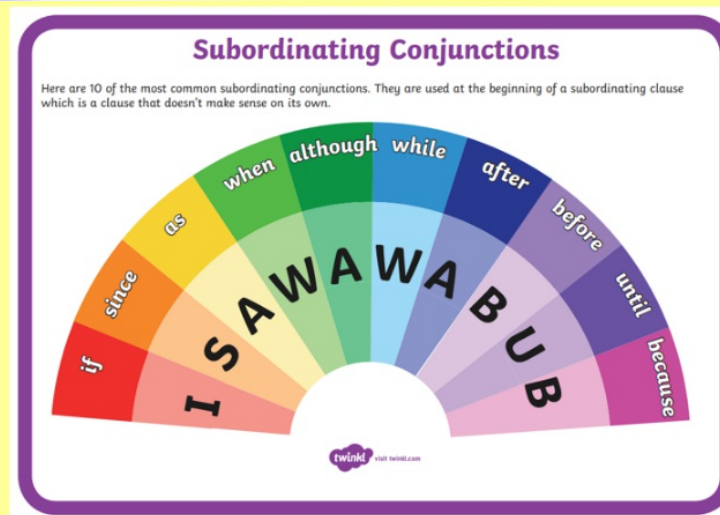
Challenge

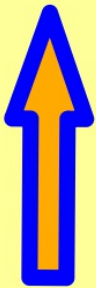

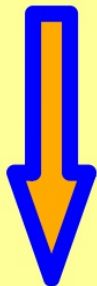

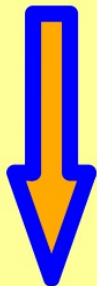
