WALT: use suffixes

Suffixes



A suffix is a letter or group of letters that goes on the end of a word and changes the word's meaning.



For the next two weeks, we are looking at the suffix:
-ation. This is added to verbs to form nouns.

When the root word ends in a consonant sound,
we just add -ation:

inform ——— information

expect ——— expectation

Suffixes

When the root word ends in 'e', we have to drop the e and add -ation:

adore ——— adoration

sense ——— sensation

The odd words out this week are:

1. pollute drops the e and adds -ion to become pollution
2. multiply drops the y and adds -ication to become multiplication

Constructing an Expanded Noun Phrase			
<small>A noun is a thing, person or idea. An expanded noun phrase provides extra information about the noun. You can use a determiner, adjective and a prepositional phrase within your expanded noun phrase to describe and specify details about the noun.</small>			
Determiner	Adjective	Noun	Prepositional Phrase
<small>A determiner is a word which comes before a noun to say whether you're talking about one thing or many things, such as 'this' or 'those'. They can also tell you how many things you're talking about, such as 'three' or 'many'.</small>	<small>An adjective is a word which describes a noun. You can use two adjectives to describe a noun but they must be separated by a comma, e.g. 'the large, noisy cat'.</small>	<small>The noun is the thing, person or idea that the expanded noun phrase is about.</small>	<small>A prepositional phrase is a word which tells you where or when or how something happens. A prepositional phrase usually includes a preposition and a noun or a pronoun.</small>
