The job of an adverb is to tell you more about a verb. An adverb tells you where, why, when or how often something is happening.

Can you spot the adverbs in these sentences?

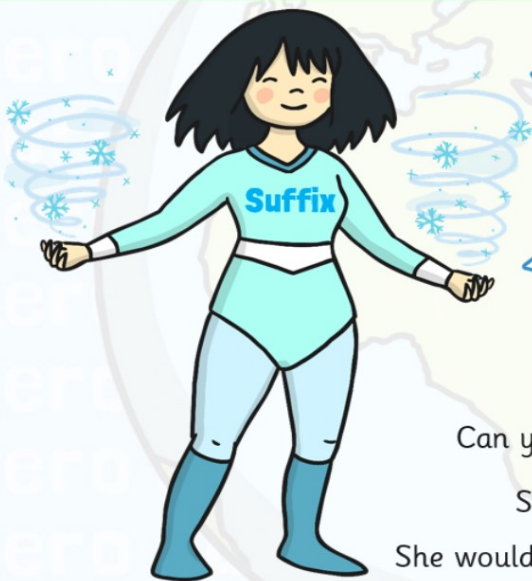
Adverb Girl flew quickly to the rescue.

The job of an adjective is to describe a noun or a pronoun.

Can you spot the adjectives in these sentences?

Adjective Man is strong and powerful.
He wears a black, green and gold outfit.




A suffix is an 'ending', used at the end of one word to turn it into another word.

Can you spot the suffix -ly in these sentences?

Suffix Girl cleverly thought of a plan.
She would bravely creep up and spy on Adjective Man.

Changing adjectives to adverbs



A suffix is a group of letters that we add to the end of a word. A suffix may change the meaning of a word or change the job that a word does.

brave + ly = bravely

(adjective) (suffix) (adverb)

Example
Suffix Girl is brave.
Suffix Girl bravely rescues people.

Through adding the suffix -ly we have changed the adjective 'brave' into the adverb 'bravely'.



Adjective (root word)	Adverb with the suffix -ly
sad	sadly
kind	kindly
weak	weakly



Unlike root words, suffixes cannot stand on their own as a complete word.

Look at what happens when the root word adjective is changed into an adverb.

Discuss what you have noticed with a friend.

Spelling Rules

The suffix -ly starts with a consonant letter, **so in most cases** it is added straight on to the root word.

Some words need to follow these rules.



Adjective (root word)	Adverb with the Suffix -ly
happy	happily
gentle	gently
frantic	frantically



If the root word ends in y with a consonant letter before it, the y is changed to i, but only if the root word has more than one syllable.

happy = happily

angry = angrily

If the root word ends with le, -ly is usually added.

gentle = gently

simple = simply

If the root word ends with ic, -ally is usually added.

basic = basically

frantic = frantically

Common exceptions to the rules: truly, duly, wholly, publicly.
