WALT: use suffixes

A suffix is a letter or group of letters that goes on the end of a word and changes the word's meaning.



For the next two weeks, we are looking at the suffix: -ly

The suffix -ly is added to an adjective to make an adverb.

What is an adverb?

An adverb is a word that describes a verb e.g. the tall man climbed *bravely* up the mountain

Suffixes

The suffix -ly starts with a consonant letter, so it is usually added straight on to root words.

<u>Root word</u>	<u>Suffix</u>	<u>Adverb</u>
sad	ly	sadly
usual	ly	usually
comical	ly	

Having said that, other rules still apply.

If the root word ends in -y, take the y away and add -ily:

happy — happily

angry — angrily


Other words don't fit this pattern - we have to learn these ones:

frantic — frantically

dramatic — dramatically

basic — basically

frantic	ally	frantically	To do something in a nervous or hurried way.
dramatic	ally	dramatically	To do something in a dramatic way.

Constructing an Expanded Noun Phrase			
A noun is a thing, person or idea. An expanded noun phrase provides extra information about the noun. You can use a determiner, adjective and a prepositional phrase within your expanded noun phrase to describe and specify details about the noun.			
Determiner	Adjective	Noun	Prepositional Phrase
A determiner is a word which comes before a noun or noun phrase, such as 'the' or 'my'. It tells the reader what noun you are going to use for the reader's information about it.	An adjective is a word which describes a noun. You can use two adjectives to describe a noun but they must be separated by a comma, e.g. the large, noisy cat.	A noun is the thing, person or idea that the expanded noun phrase is about.	A prepositional phrase is a word which contains a preposition or direction. A prepositional phrase usually includes a preposition and a noun or a pronoun.
