<p>A determiner is a word which comes before a noun or noun phrase, such as 'the' or 'my'. You can use two adjectives to describe a noun but they must be separated by a comma, e.g. the large, noisy cat.</p> <p>colourful gleaming ancient golden disappearing secret diamond mysterious strange crazy beautiful</p>	<p>The noun is the thing, person or place that the expanded noun phrase is about.</p> <p>castle tree engine bridge telescope pond candy paper balloon cactus house candy imagination</p>	<p>A prepositional phrase is a word which relates place or direction. A prepositional phrase usually includes a preposition and a noun or a pronoun.</p> <p>beside the river over the moon in the water during the night through the window this morning on the table between the houses underneath the waterfall before morning towards home</p>
