We can confirm there have been no positive cases this week. We will be placing the below table in each newsletter to keep you updated on the number of either positive or potential cases. You can be assured that we are tracking everything carefully and responding to risks as they arise, balancing the need to stay open and the need to reduce risk and transmission. If you have any concerns in relation to any of these numbers, please contact office@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk. They are not a reason for a child to be absent from school. Should it be necessary for your child to isolate, we will be in contact.

We are in a period where there are many colds and coughs around which may include symptoms associated with coronavirus. As has been communicated regularly, whenever

anyone has any one or more symptoms of coronavirus they must isolate with their household and seek a test or isolate for 10 days. This applies to all members of the school community – staff, children and families. This has led to a larger than usual number of staff and children absent – some with general illness and some with coronavirus symptoms who are awaiting test results. For some who hear of absences, this understandably raises anxieties. We are seeking to be as transparent as possible with families – reporting suspected and confirmed cases each week via the newsletter.

We have received a number of enquiries from parents this week in relation to staff members who have been taken ill and are not in work – usually class teachers. Whilst we understand there are significant anxieties at the moment, it is never appropriate to share specific details of an individual's illness – staff or child. Government guidance support this, stating schools MUST NOT share this information. At that point, and recognising the heightened anxieties, this must come down to trust between home and school. We can assure and reassure all families that we are following government guidance in response to potential cases and will do so if there is a confirmed case. We would ask that families do not seek further information when they hear that an adult or child has been taken ill. If we need to be in contact with families as a result of the information and symptoms the individual has, then we will do that. Otherwise, we need to continue with the principle that NO NEWS IS GOOD NEWS, as difficult as that may be in such challenging times. We would also ask that families avoid sharing anything on social media, however tempting that may be, as it will fuel confusion and uncertainty for families who are already worried. In the best interests of the whole school community, please work with us on this and trust us to act reliably and responsibly in the interests of reducing transmission and keeping Chesswood Junior School open.



Covid-19 Safety and Confusion

Dear Parent.

PLEASE follow the ANY ONE RULE at ALL TIMES

There continues to be significant confusion about school attendance when ANYONE in a household is displaying ANY ONE of the symptoms below. We have created the table below to help remove any remaining uncertainty.

The COVID-19 TRIO

ANY ONE of the following? Please Isolate immediately.



New Cough And Persistent Cough A new cough is defined as a cough that you or your child would not normally have.

A persistent cough is an involuntary cough that happens every few minutes for more than an hour, 3 or more coughing episodes within 24 hours. If you have BOTH of these symptoms ANYONE in your household MUST Isolate immediately.

OR



HIGH TEMPERATURE 37.8 ° C 100 ° F A high temperature measured with a reliable thermometer. It is best to take 2 or 3 readings to reduce errors over 15 minutes. If you have no thermometer then NHS state 'any new high temperature where your child feel hot to touch' If a high temperature is established over a period of 15 minutes. ANYONE in your household MUST Isolate immediately.

OR



Loss of TASTE Or SMELL

If you or a member of your household loses their sense of taste or smell ANYONE in your household MUST Isolate immediately.

- ISOLATE YOUR WHOLE HOUSEHOLD IMMEDIATELY YOU BELIEVE <u>ANYONE</u> HAS ANY ONE SYMPTOM FROM THE COVID-19 TRIO
- <u>NEVER</u> TAKE A CHANCE SENDING A CHILD TO SCHOOL IF <u>ANYONE</u> IN THE HOUSEHOLD HAS <u>ANY ONE</u> OF THE COVID TRIO SYMPTOMS OR YOU BELIEVE THEY MIGHT HAVE.

Dear parents and guardians,

This is an important letter to share some information on how we can work together to make sure we can continue to give children and young people the best education in the safest way possible.

One important part of ensuring the safety and wellbeing of pupils, parents and our communities is testing for coronavirus. We all have a duty to make sure that the right people have access to get tested at the right time. Every time a test is used inappropriately, a person with Covid-19 symptoms may miss out on getting tested.

Therefore, I ask that you all follow these principles:

- You should only book a test if your child has any of these three coronavirus symptoms:
 - a high temperature: any new high temperature where your child feels hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature)
 - a new continuous cough: coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
 - a loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste: a noticeable loss of smell or taste or things smell and taste different to normal
- Your child does not need a test if they have a runny nose, are sneezing or feeling unwell but do not have a temperature, cough or loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste because these are not normally symptoms of coronavirus.
- If you are unsure about whether to get a test, please check the official list of symptoms on the NHS website, which is reviewed regularly: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/
- Only the person with symptoms should get a test. You do not need to get a test
 for anyone else in the household unless they also have any of the three
 symptoms listed above. All members of the household need to self-isolate whilst
 waiting for the test result.

- If the person with symptoms' test comes back positive, other members of their household should continue self-isolating for 14 days and only get a test if they develop coronavirus symptoms.
- If a pupil in a class or bubble tests positive for coronavirus, anyone who is advised to self-isolate does not require a test unless they subsequently develop symptoms.

No one else in the same class or bubble as the symptomatic person needs to take any action unless advised by the school. Schools have detailed guidance and access to a Department for Education and Public Health England helpline for advice and support.

Contacts of a person who has tested positive must follow the guidance carefully and in full, which means they must stay at home for 14 days. This is because it can take several days following contact with an infected person before an individual develops symptoms or the virus can be detected. Students should only book a test if they get symptoms.

It is vital for children's learning and future opportunities that they are able to return to school and college. It is therefore vitally important that all we work together and do our bit to make this possible.



Following a range of concerns shared by parents and local residents, over time, about Ladydell and Chesswood Road collection and drop off arrangements, school leaders have taken an number of additional actions recently to reduce risks for children and families. This online feedback form has been set up to capture parent views about Ladydell and Chesswood Road safety as they have been somewhat controversial. We would like to

- gain feedback about near misses you may have experienced or witnessed;
- to determine whether the actions we are taking have made a positive difference and
- whether we should continue or stop patrolling and intervening highways;
- consider any other alternatives to improve child and family safety at drop off and collection times.

It is likely that this form will take 15-20 mins to complete. The form needs to be completed in one sitting i.e. it cannot be saved.



10. Food During Isolation – All – ACTION

We Need Your Help!

Could you spare a small amount of time to deliver a food parcel to an isolating family?

As many of you will have seen during the summer Marcus Rashford championed the need for families eligible for free school meals to receive those meals at home if the family needed to isolate due to COVID 19. Ensuring children have enough food to eat whether they are in school or not is essential. As potential

cases rise and therefore the number of families isolate at home a small number require additional support to ensure their children have sufficient food.

Once a family has a potential case, isolates and is also eligible for free school meals we will ask whether it would be helpful to receive the food parcels. Where it is helpful, they will need to be delivered to the home given the risks associated with spreading the virus near the school community. The following process for distribution has been set up in priority order:

- 1. The isolating family seek to arrange friends and family (who are not currently isolating) to collect food directly from school and deliver to their home, taking appropriate precautions to avoid any COVID transmission.
- 2. If there are no friends or family available, we hope to have a group of willing volunteers who will collect the food parcel from school and deliver to their home, taking appropriate precautions to avoid any COVID transmission.
- 3. If there are no volunteers available, school staff will deliver the food however our capacity to do this given all other competing demands is severely restricted and we need a group of community minded families to help us help our families.

If you have a small amount of time available and you are willing to collect and deliver a small number of food parcels please email: Office@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk

Within the email please include your name and your child's name and class. If you could give an indication which days you might be available that would be fantastic. We don't expect there many deliveries that volunteers undertake, especially if we have a large group of volunteers. We will provide guidance on how the collection and delivery may be done in a way that is COVID Transmission Safe.

Thank you in advance for any help you can provide with this process.

11. INSET Days – All – Information

We will be running childcare facilities on the INSET day on Friday 23rd October 2020.

The details are as follows:

- The day runs from 7:30am to 3:30pm to include breakfast
- A range of activities will be provided throughout the day, to include arts and crafts, board and card games, sports, nature documentaries and general play
- Children will need a packed lunch and a fruit snack, breakfast will be supplied between 7:30am-8:15am
- The cost for the day will be £25.00 per child to be paid in full
- Numbers will be limited and based on a first come first served basis, for paid only bookings (non-refundable)
- The children will be cared for throughout the day by members of our school support staff, all of whom are suitably qualified, DBS checked and hold first aid qualifications


