You can be assured that we are tracking everything carefully and responding to risks as they arise, balancing the need to stay open and the need to reduce risk and transmission. Should it be necessary for your child to isolate, we will be in contact.

The principles to follow for the appointments:


- 10-minute appointments must be strictly observed to reduce waiting/ mixing, including entry and exit. Timers will be used by teachers to stick to appointment times. Appointments cannot overrun.
- One parent to attend, unless there are exceptional circumstances
- Children are not to attend unless there are exceptional circumstances
- Alternative options are available please email your class teachers to arrange
- Pupils with EHCP and SEN will have a meeting arranged by the SEN team before Christmas, either in school or via a phone conversation. As usual, parents are welcome to book a parents' consultation, but may also feel that two meetings are not necessary at these times.

Only the parent with an appointment will be allowed on site – you will receive a confirmation email when you book, which must be shown (via your mobile phone or hard copy is fine) to gain access to the site.

There are now only 15 days left to complete your online secondary school application. Parents of children currently in Year 6 will need to complete the secondary school online admissions process, at the very latest by Saturday 31st October 11:59pm. Please, please, please prioritise this process in the interests of your child's learning and happiness in the coming years.

Black History Month is an annual observance originating in the United States where it is also known as African-American History Month. It has received official recognition from governments in the United States and Canada, and more recently has been observed in Ireland, the Netherlands, and the United Kingdom. It began as a way of remembering important people and events in the history of Africa and the African diaspora (A diaspora (/daɪˈæspərə/) is a scattered population whose origin lies in a separate geographic locale.). It is celebrated in February in the United States and Canada, while in Ireland, the Netherlands, and the United Kingdom it is observed in October.

We are very proud to have such a diverse school community. Our diversity helps us to thrive together. In recognition that respect, understanding and knowledge underpin a successful community we are seeking to embrace and celebrate this important annual event. Key Skills				
Attitude	Focus—you will often be the only engineer on site doing your job, so it is important that you can focus on what you need to do and that you can work on a task independently with self-motivation.			
Creativity	Although factual knowledge is important so are creative skills. You may need design a website and publicity material generating new and innovative ideas.			
Relationships	Relationships with other professionals are important. When you are on a site testing you will work with lots of other people such as architects, council officers and surveyors. You need to be able to communicate clearly and confidently.			
Organisation	Managing risk is a large part of my job. The machinery used is very powerful so has to be used safely.

ACRO is a skills-based programme focusing on Attitude, Creativity, Relationships and Organisation skills and how these apply to skills used in school and within various employment and career opportunities. Linking to our 'Life Opportunities' curriculum driver, children engage with how ACRO is relevant to life in the real world through engaging with ACRO Champions. ACRO Champions are individuals, historical and within our community (including many visitors to school) who demonstrate and use the skills and knowledge we focus on in school within their work. Within the curriculum, ACRO Champions are used to make learning real and relevant - for example, in Y3 science (rocks and soils), children looked at the work of Graham Carter (parent) who is an engineering geologist. 
