COVID-19 Update

In line with the current national and local situation regarding cases of COVID-19, we are dealing with more positive cases linked to the school. Wherever there is a direct risk to pupils or staff at school, as a result of an identified positive case, we will communicate this immediately to those affected ensuring they isolate in line with track and trace expectations.

This will occur when an identified positive case has

- had contact with any staff or pupils in the 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms
- had contact with any staff or pupils in the 48 hours prior to the test (where asymptomatic)

Where a positive case has had contact with a bubble, we will close the bubble for a period of 10 days from the last contact.

Where a positive case has not had contact with any staff or child in school (for example, they were not in school for over 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms), there will be no further action required by the school.

Do NOT attempt to send your child to school for any reason if anyone in your household is displaying any one or combination of symptoms below:

- A new, continuous cough
- High temperature
- Loss, change in normal sense of taste or smell

If <u>anyone</u> has <u>any one</u> or more symptoms of coronavirus they must isolate with their household and seek a test or isolate for 10 days. Other members of the household must isolate for 14 days or until a negative test result has been received. Phase 5	Independent learning, use the links to visit other websites; our game zone and knowledge	
	organisers for different subjects.	

3. COVID Reporting - All - PLEASE READ AND ACTION

If <u>anyone in your household</u> has <u>any one</u> of the COVID symptoms, you <u>must</u> get tested and inform the school via the COVID case reporting form on our school website. This includes weekends and holidays; it is really important for this form to be completed to allow the school to follow the appropriate protocol and take action as soon as possible.

If any of the following are true:

- Your child has experienced symptoms
- Your child has tested positive
- Anyone in your household experiences any one of the three symptoms
- You are a staff member, external staff (supply teacher, peripatetic music teacher) or volunteer and you or anyone in your household has developed symptoms or tested positive

You should complete the COVID-19 online form as soon as possible

During school holidays and weekends only – when there is no other alternative, if it is not possible to complete the form or email and you have no other alternative, please text 07837971769

Text only, please do not call or use this phone number for any other reason, other than COVID reporting.

Please only use this number to report a confirmed positive case.

Text: Positive COVID Case (if you have a positive test result). A member of our team will contact you to get the information verbally, please only use this as an absolute last resort.

As indicated, it is our sincere hope that none of the above need to be used by any family or staff member. However, if it does, we expect that all members of our school community being aware of and using this online reporting system will allow a quick response in the interests of all members of our community, particularly those who are vulnerable and those with vulnerable family members.

4. Warm Weather Information – All – Please Read

As the weather is warming up outside, it is really important that good sun safety is maintained at home and in school.

- All pupils are allowed to wear their PE kit any day during the school week
- Children may wear hats, sunglasses and have suncream to apply during the school day if necessary
- Children should carry a water bottle with them to stay hydrated during the day

5. Clothes Recycling Scheme – All – Information



We are pleased to announce that Chesswood has organised a clothes & shoe collection with Bag2School on **Thursday 15th July 2021** in order to raise funds for our pond and wildlife area.

Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 it has now paid out over £36 million. As well as raising vitally needed funds for Chesswood, it also helps the environment by helping to divert

unwanted textiles away from landfill. By getting involved in our Bag2School collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles – this can include adult and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys, (please refer to http://uk.bog2school.com/ for full details). In addition to raising much needed funds it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

Bag2School will be collecting from Chesswood on Thursday 15th July 2021. Please bring your bag (or bags!) to the upper school or front playground collection points on Tuesday 13th, Wednesday 14th or Thursday 15th July (by 9am at the latest) and help us have a really good collection. Many thanks for helping us with this unique fundraising opportunity.

8. Transition Days - Information

Infant

Following the Government's delay in the final easing of Covid restrictions until at least Monday 19th July, we have made adjustments to our transition programme for current Year 2s. Springfield and Lyndhurst children will still visit Chesswood, but this will now be once for an outdoor assembly only. These will be on separate days for each infant school, so bubbles of children are not compromised. Year 2 children will not receive large group tours of inside the building and Year 2s will not spend the day at Chesswood as part of the traditional July transition day - instead, they will follow a virtual transition programme within their own schools. Parents of Year 2 children have been written to with further details of the revised transition programme for this year. We look forward to welcoming our new starters through these adapted events over the next few weeks. Further information for what we will do with children in school for transition day will follow.

Year 6

With secondary school around the corner, we have been busy with our transition support. We have met with all secondary schools to update them on the children joining them in September, and they are looking forward to welcoming your child. They will be liaising with parents directly around virtual sessions in place of the West Sussex transition day and some children will have bespoke transition arrangements. If this pertains to your child, then you will have had notification of such arrangements. We will also be delivering a comprehensive programme of support to ensure your children leave us feeling happy and confident about their next steps. This will include:

- Transition programme this will entail classroom sessions on what to expect in secondary school
 including routines, timetables and expectations, (increased independence, self-management, and
 organisation); mental health and wellbeing support to build resilience; and work around healthy
 friendships and relationships with peers. We will also be celebrating the final leg of their
 Chesswood journey.
- 'Journal for the Journey' this is a comprehensive transition booklet with activities and reflections that your child will be bringing home shortly. We will be setting some activities as homework ready for discussion in class.
- Online Transition Success programme this is an exciting programme designed for parents and children to complete together at home. It includes 6 modules with videos and activities to help parents to support their children with getting prepared for secondary school, building resilience, and staying safe. More information to follow shortly.

fantastic!




