Do NOT attempt to send your child to school for any reason if anyone in your household is displaying any one or combination of symptoms below:

- A new, continuous cough
- High temperature
- Loss, change in normal sense of taste or smell

If <u>anyone</u> has <u>any one</u> or more symptoms of coronavirus they must isolate with their household and seek a test or isolate for 10 days. Other members of the household must isolate for 14 days or until a negative test result has been received. 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3. Lockdown Learning – All – Information

From Thursday 7th January, these will be the key pages to guide children in their daily learning. Class teachers will be updating daily, setting activities across all relevant areas of the curriculum. We will seek to engage children as much as possible, providing email access to class teachers so that key work can be submitted, or advice sought if required. If closure is prolonged, we will set up class pages to celebrate quality outcomes from each class. From here, you can navigate to each specific year group page. This will include tasks uploaded each day.

4. COVID Reporting – All – PLEASE READ AND ACTION

If **anyone in your household** has **any one** of the COVID symptoms, you **must** get tested and inform the school via the COVID case reporting form on our school website. This includes weekends and holidays; it is really important for this form to be completed to allow the school to follow the appropriate protocol and take action as soon as possible.

If any of the following are true:

- Your child has experienced symptoms
- Your child has tested positive
- Anyone in your household experiences any one of the three symptoms
- You are a staff member, external staff (supply teacher, peripatetic music teacher) or volunteer and you or anyone in your household has developed symptoms or tested positive

You should complete the COVID-19 online form as soon as possible

8. Year 3 Autumn Reading Prize Winners – Year 3 – Information

We are delighted to confirm the 6 winners of prizes for reading following our prize draw on Friday 18th December. To qualify for the prize draw, children needed to meet their individual reading target, which they achieve by passing AR quizzes on books they have read. This target system takes into account the varying levels of books that the year group would read so that it is fair and an equal challenge for every child. When a child meets their target, they earn 100HP and earn an entry into the prize draw. A number of children go on to meet their target 2 or 3 times (if not more) and so this means they are entered into the prize draw more to reflect this, thus increasing their chances of winning. At the end of each half term, each class carries out a prize draw to select the winner for that class. An additional prize is made available for the class that has the highest percentage of children that meet their target, which in this half term was 3ML - where every single child met their target at least 100%!
