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COVID-19 Update

In line with the current national and local situation regarding cases of COVID-19, we are dealing with more positive cases linked to the school. Wherever there is a direct risk to pupils or staff at school, as a result of an identified positive case, we will communicate this immediately to those affected ensuring they isolate in line with track and trace expectations.

This will occur when an identified positive case has

- had contact with any staff or pupils in the 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms
- had contact with any staff or pupils in the 48 hours prior to the test (where asymptomatic)

Where a positive case has had contact with a bubble, we will close the bubble for a period of 10 days from the last contact.

Where a positive case has not had contact with any staff or child in school (for example, they were not in school for over 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms), there will be no further action required by the school.

Do NOT attempt to send your child to school for any reason if anyone in your household is displaying any one or combination of symptoms below:

- A new, continuous cough
- High temperature
- Loss, change in normal sense of taste or smell

If <u>anyone</u> has <u>any one</u> or more symptoms of coronavirus they must isolate with their household and seek a test or isolate for 10 days. Other members of the household must isolate for 14 days or until a negative test result has been received. 2. Lockdown Learning – All – Information

From Thursday 7th January, these will be the key pages to guide children in their daily learning. Class teachers will be updating daily, setting activities across all relevant areas of the curriculum. We will seek to engage children as much as possible, providing email access to class teachers so that key work can be submitted, or advice sought if required. If closure is prolonged, we will set up class pages to celebrate quality outcomes from each class. From here, you can navigate to each specific year group page. This will include tasks uploaded each day.

3. COVID Reporting – All – PLEASE READ AND ACTION

If <u>anyone in your household</u> has <u>any one</u> of the COVID symptoms, you <u>must</u> get tested and inform the school via the COVID case reporting form on our school website. This includes weekends and holidays; it is really important for this form to be completed to allow the school to follow the appropriate protocol and take action as soon as possible.

If any of the following are true:

- Your child has experienced symptoms
- Your child has tested positive
- Anyone in your household experiences any one of the three symptoms
- You are a staff member, external staff (supply teacher, peripatetic music teacher) or volunteer and you or anyone in your household has developed symptoms or tested positive

You should complete the COVID-19 online form as soon as possible

As indicated, it is our sincere hope that none of the above need to be used by any family or staff member. However, if it does, we expect that all members of our school community being aware of and using this online reporting system will allow a quick response in the interests of all members of our community, particularly those who are vulnerable and those with vulnerable family members.

4. Year 6 Bristol Residential – July 2021

Following our message last week, we have now been advised that the Youth Hostel in Bristol will not be re-opening until August 2021. Regrettably this means that the Year 6 residential in July **has now been cancelled**. We know that children will be disappointed by this, but the Year 6 team will be making plans for other exciting activities to be carried out during that week so that there is a fabulous finish to their time at Chesswood. For parents we think it is helpful to have this confirmation sooner rather than later and we can now arrange for monies paid to be refunded to you. Unfortunately, our system does not allow us to refund monies electronically so refunds will need to be made by cheque. We have set up a form on the school website for parents to confirm whom the cheque should be made payable to. The form can be found under latest correspondence or by clicking

As soon as we receive your information, we will arrange for a refund to be made. If your child is currently in school, then the cheque will be handed to your child at the end of the school day. If your child is not in school, then it will be sent by post to the primary address on our school system. We will aim to return the monies to you as quickly as we can but please bear with us due to the numbers involved.

Current Year 5 parents

As you may be aware, there is usually a residential trip to Bristol at the beginning of Year 6. As you can see above, the trip for the current Year 6 children which was postponed from September 2020 to July 2021 has unfortunately now been cancelled. We made a provisional booking for September 2021 as the trip takes months to be prepare but a decision has now been made to postpone the trip from September 2021 to July 2022. This is due partly to the Youth Hostel only operating a phased opening from August 2021 but also to allow parents more time to make a decision and prepare for the trip. We will send a letter out to Year 5 parents giving details of the residential during the summer term and will then hold a presentation for parents at the beginning of the Autumn term in September 2021.

9. Fuel Hardship Grant

Financial support is available for families who are struggling to pay their bills this winter. The County Council is working with Citizens Advice to offer a DWP Covid Winter Grant Scheme for families in need across West Sussex.

The closing date for this funding is 31ST MARCH 2021.

The grant can be used for a range of things, from paying gas, electric and water bills, boiler repairs, purchasing blankets, slow cookers, heaters. Other help may be mobile phone top ups, energy advice, benefit checks referrals for specialist debt advice.

The criteria for who can apply is broad and includes;

- Families who have had to claim Universal Credit and don't have significant savings
- Families on Universal Credit, home schooling and worried about heating their home
- Families in debt and struggling to pay their gas or other bills
- Care leavers on a low income
- People with disabilities who are worried about putting their heating on.
