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1. COVID-19 Update

We can confirm there has been one positive case this week, which parents have been informed about. If you have any concerns in relation to any of these numbers, please contact office@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk. These figures are not a reason for a child to be absent from school. Should it be necessary for your child to isolate, we will be in contact.

Do NOT attempt to send your child to school for any reason if anyone in your household is displaying any one or combination of symptoms below:

- High temperature
- Loss, change in normal sense of taste or smell

If <u>anyone</u> has <u>any one</u> or more symptoms of coronavirus they must isolate with their household and seek a test or isolate for 10 days. Other members of the household must isolate for 14 days or until a negative test result has been received. Phase 5	Independent learning, use the links to visit other websites; our game zone and knowledge		
	organisers for different subjects.		

4. COVID Reporting – All – PLEASE READ AND ACTION

If <u>anyone in your household</u> has <u>any one</u> of the COVID symptoms, you <u>must</u> get tested and inform the school via the COVID case reporting form on our school website. This includes weekends and holidays; it is really important for this form to be completed to allow the school to follow the appropriate protocol and take action as soon as possible.

If any of the following are true:

- Your child attending Chesswood has experienced symptoms
- Your child attending Chesswood has tested positive
- Anyone in your household experiences any one of the three symptoms
- You are a staff member, external staff (supply teacher, peripatetic music teacher) or volunteer and you or anyone in your household has developed symptoms or tested positive


Please only use this number to report a confirmed positive case.

We need to change the way children give and receive Christmas cards this year, so please carefully read the below guidelines for our festive post this year;

- * Children may give Christmas cards to other people in the Chesswood community, but we must quarantine them before handing them out. The quarantine period is currently 72 hours.
- * Each class will have a Christmas post box for cards to be posted into for children and adults <u>in</u> their class
