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COVID-19 Update

In line with the current national and local situation regarding cases of COVID-19, we are dealing with more positive cases linked to the school. Wherever there is a direct risk to pupils or staff at school, as a result of an identified positive case, we will communicate this immediately to those affected ensuring they isolate in line with track and trace expectations.

This will occur when an identified positive case has

- had contact with any staff or pupils in the 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms
- had contact with any staff or pupils in the 48 hours prior to the test (where asymptomatic)

Where a positive case has had contact with a bubble, we will close the bubble for a period of 10 days from the last contact.

Where a positive case has not had contact with any staff or child in school (for example, they were not in school for over 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms), there will be no further action required by the school.

Do NOT attempt to send your child to school for any reason if anyone in your household is displaying any one or combination of symptoms below:

- A new, continuous cough
- High temperature
- Loss, change in normal sense of taste or smell

If <u>anyone</u> has <u>any one</u> or more symptoms of coronavirus they must isolate with their household and seek a test or isolate for 10 days. Other members of the household must isolate for 14 days or until a negative test result has been received. Phase 1	The first thing you should do is make sure you have finished this week's year group

Phase 2	Tasks set for the specific week of isolation – Reading, Writing and Maths.			
Phase 3	Wider curriculum tasks – tasks are set for the half term across multiple subjects.			
Phase 4	During each day of isolation:			
	Read an appropriate book for at least 30 minutes			
	Complete IXL English tasks for at least 30 minutes			
	Complete IXL Maths tasks for at least 30 minutes			
	If you do not have access to the internet please let your class teacher know immediately			
	and they will look at options during the period of isolation.			

3. COVID Reporting – All – PLEASE READ AND ACTION

If <u>anyone in your household</u> has <u>any one</u> of the COVID symptoms, you <u>must</u> get tested and inform the school via the COVID case reporting form on our school website. This includes weekends and holidays; it is really important for this form to be completed to allow the school to follow the appropriate protocol and take action as soon as possible.

If any of the following are true:

- Your child has experienced symptoms
- Your child has tested positive
- Anyone in your household experiences any one of the three symptoms
- You are a staff member, external staff (supply teacher, peripatetic music teacher) or volunteer and you or anyone in your household has developed symptoms or tested positive

You should complete the COVID-19 online form as soon as possible

During school holidays and weekends only – when there is no other alternative, if it is not possible to complete the form or email and you have no other alternative, please text 07837971769 Text only, please do not call or use this phone number for any other reason, other than COVID reporting.

Please only use this number to report a confirmed positive case.

Text: Positive COVID Case (if you have a positive test result). A member of our team will contact you to get the information verbally, **please only use this as an absolute last resort.**

As indicated, it is our sincere hope that none of the above need to be used by any family or staff member. However, if it does, we expect that all members of our school community being aware of and using this online reporting system will allow a quick response in the interests of all members of our community, particularly those who are vulnerable and those with vulnerable family members.

4. IMPORTANT UPDATES – ALL – PLEASE READ

COVID SYMPTOM REPORTING

All families are asked to continue the normal reporting arrangements in the event that they develop COVID symptoms, until Saturday 3rd April. We would ask families to provide an initial alert so we can prepare our communication to other families; undertake the test and confirm the test outcomes as soon as possible using our online form. This may be as late as Wednesday 7th April.

Wherever symptoms develop from Sunday 4th April, there is no need to inform school, it will not affect the school community as more than 48 hours will have elapsed, which is the recognised incubation period.

Year 3 Arrival Arrangements – from Monday 19th March

From Monday 19th March ALL Year 3 children will enter school using the Chesswood Road pedestrian entrance. We are making this change as a small step towards normality as the COVID risks continue to fall. It is important that all families respect the 'No waiting or queueing' and 'drop and go' concepts. With more @approximately 500+ children and adults using the space within a 20 minute period dropping off

and collection continues to be one of the highest areas of risk for transmission but it is easily reduced when every family follows the practice of 'no waiting or queueing' and 'drop and go'.

Year 4-6 Arrival Arrangements- from Monday 19th March

To reduce pressure and queuing at the Ladydell road entrance we ask that all children walking past the Chesswood road pedestrian entrance, to use that entrance. Staff will guide children into the Chesswood road pedestrian entrance if they are passing. We know that this little bit of liberty has been enjoyed by children who like meet at Ladydell Road. However, children will meet immediately on their playground when entering from the Chesswood Road entrance and it will reduce pressure and queuing at the Ladydell Road entrance.

5. Community Hub Food & Essentials – All – Information

Those children and families that are not eligible for Free School Meals will be able to access support for food and essentials, should they be required, via the WSCC Community Hub. The Community Hub can be contacted on 0330 222 7980 and is open 08:00 – 20:00 7 days a week. More information can be found via the West Sussex Families in Need webpage.

When collecting your child at 4.15pm please enter at the Chesswood Road entrance and wait in a socially distanced area on the front playground. The children will come round to the front playground to be dismissed to you. After collecting your child, please leave the school site by the pedestrian entrance on Chesswood Road and give priority to those entering the site and ensure the gate is clear for you to leave. If your child is walking home by themselves and are below Year 5 please inform Mr Quick or Mr Haggart in advance on <u>pe@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk</u> they will also be leaving via the Chesswood Road entrance.

For those children who are attending afternoon interventions you should have received an individual invite for a separate club, if you require any help with this please email <u>pe@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk</u> Just a reminder this is an active club and expect all pupils to be actively taking part at all times.

8. Smarties Fundraiser – All – Information

During the Easter holidays long-awaited work will commence in the lower school playground to create a new pond with a nature and wildlife area, with funds which have been raised by Friends of Chesswood (our PTA) over the past couple of years. New trees and shrubs are being planted which should attract birds and other wildlife. We would like to raise further funds to build a bird hide so that the children can watch the birds and wildlife.





To do this we are holding a Smarties Fundraiser. Each child will be given a tube of smarties to bring home. We would then encourage them to be good citizens and carry out tasks for friends and family over the Easter holidays in exchange for coins (of any amount) which can be put in their smarties tubes. Please then return the smarties tubes by Friday 23rd April, with the child's name and class written on them to the class teachers. Housepoints will be awarded

for the most tasks carried out in each class. All funds raised will go towards the Bird Hide.

Roho and Rafiki – All – Information 14.


