We would encourage all families to discuss this resource with their children to help embed the message. You could start by asking them if they remember what each letter in PANTS stands for. Resources can be found at –



Head Lice





Dear Parents and Carers

We are writing to inform you that there have recently been a couple of cases of head lice identified in school. Whilst head lice are nothing more than a nuisance, it is important that children are checked on a weekly basis so that they can be dealt with quickly and before they are allowed to spread.

As there have been a couple of cases, we would ask you to check your child's head as soon as possible. Please follow the simple routine below to ensure you are doing all you can to keep head lice outbreaks to a minimum.

If your child has nits:


- Wash their hair and apply lots of conditioner. Do not rinse out
- Divide the hair into sections and comb from roots to ends, checking the hairline and crown very thoroughly
- Repeat the above every three days for two weeks
- Check the hair of every member in your family

An infestation can last for two weeks, even if you are thorough in your nit combing, so children will still need to attend school during this time.


