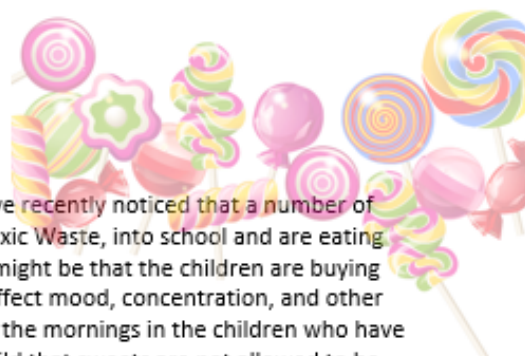

3. Sweets in School – All

Sweets in School



Teachers across the school, especially in year 6, have recently noticed that a number of children are bringing sweets, such as Haribo and Toxic Waste, into school and are eating them on the journey here or in the playground - it might be that the children are buying them on the way into school. High levels of sugar affect mood, concentration, and other aspects of behaviour, which has been noticeable in the mornings in the children who have been eating sweets. Please can you remind your child that sweets are not allowed to be eaten in school and are not a good idea before school.

Through science and design technology, we teach children about healthy eating and diet; health is also a core message in our School Brochure:

1.3.3. Child Health and Well-Being Early health and well-being provides a firm foundation for later life. Allied to SMSC; securing child health and well-being ensures improved achievement for all in the widest sense. It is, therefore, a core school responsibility. It is an integral part of the ethos, values and principles pervading children's school experience underpinned by a 'formal curriculum' that supports children's ability to stay healthy; enjoy a sense of well-being and hold a zest for life.

11.1 Break Arrangements Breaktime is staggered to allow children more space to play: year 3 & 5 from 10am – 10.15am and year 4 & 6 from 11am – 11.15am. Children are encouraged to have a healthy snack to eat and water during this break.

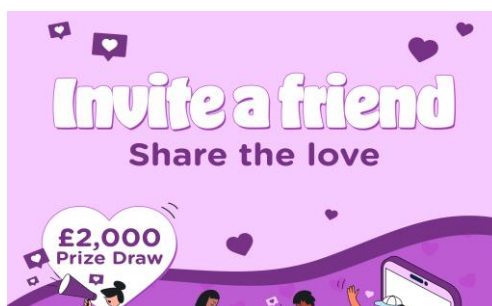

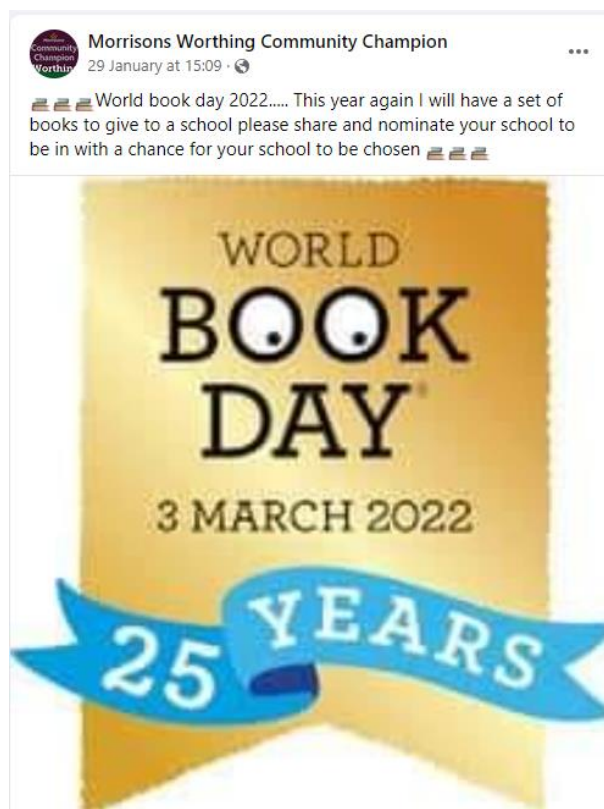

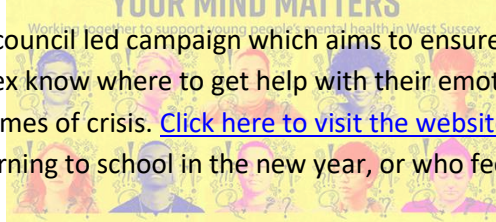

12. E-Scooters – All – Information from WSCC Road Safety Team

In recent months, it has been brought to our attention that there is an increasing number of individuals riding e-scooters on the public highway, pavements and in public open spaces, often causing a nuisance to other road and pavement users.

E-scooters are a relatively new mode of transport and as such the Government is trialling various schemes and developing the guidance around their safe use. However, (at the time of writing this letter) many are still unaware e-scooters are classed as 'Personal Light Electric Vehicles' (PLEVs), which means they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements such as:

- **Driving licence**
- **Insurance**
- **Number plates**
- **Lighting**
- **Brakes**
- **Type approval**
- **Road tax**
- **Crash helmets etc.**



Without these, e-scooters cannot be used legally on the road and certainly not until legislation has been put in place. In no circumstances is it legal to ride on an e-scooter with a passenger(s) and is considered extremely dangerous. The illegal use of an e-scooter, on the public highway or pavement, is considered a criminal offence and can potentially bring about criminal proceedings. The Government is currently trialling the use of approved rental e-scooters as environmentally friendly modes of transport in some specific locations in the UK (find out more here: <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/e-scooter-trials-guidance-for-users>).

Only approved rental e-scooters may be used in the Government-led trial areas, in line with specific terms of use. For the rest of the country, under current law, e-scooters can only be used on private land. The police are obliged to take action against anyone who is caught repeatedly using an e-scooter illegally or in a way that causes a nuisance to others. In these circumstances, the police have the power to seize the e-scooter under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act/165 of the Road Traffic Act. There will be more and more police presence in the coming weeks and months specifically targeting e-scooter users in West Sussex. 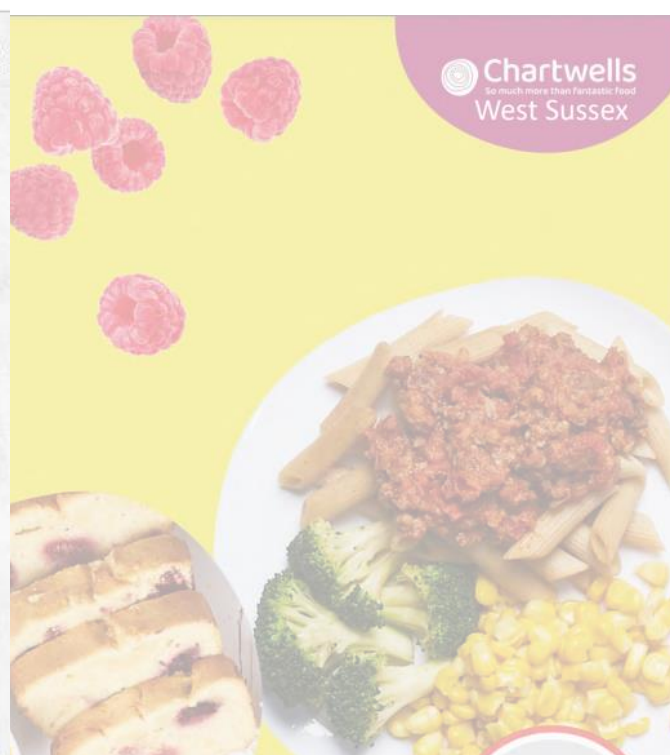

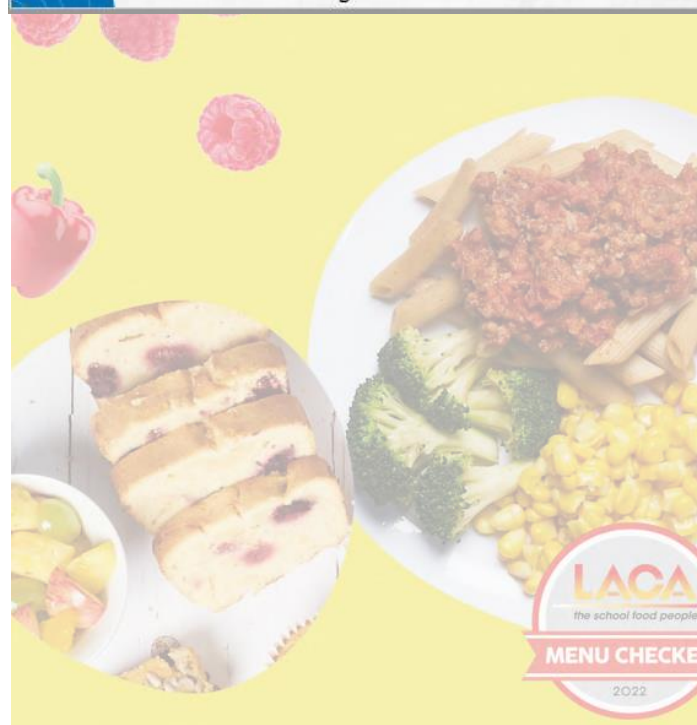
