Young Carers

Does your child or a child you know help to look after a relative with a disability, special needs, illness, mental health condition, or drug or alcohol problem?

Young carers may undertake all sorts of help, support and care activities beyond normal expectations of a child in the same age group i.e. beyond keeping the bed room tidy and helping with some household chores.

Examples of help, support and care activities

- Practical tasks, like cooking, housework and shopping.
- Physical care, such as helping someone out of bed.

- Emotional support, including talking to someone who is distressed.
- Personal care, such as helping someone dress.
- Managing the family budget and collecting prescriptions.
- Helping to give medicine.
- Helping someone communicate.
- Looking after brothers and sisters.

The Department for Education has recently changed who is eligible for Free School Meals to include children from households with No Recourse to Public Funds (subject to income thresholds). Even if your child was not previously eligible, you may now be entitled to support so please read below.

Are you eligible for Free School Meals?

The following children are now eligible for support:

- · Children from families with No Recourse to Public Funds with a right to remain in the UK on the grounds
- Children from families with No Recourse to Public Funds with a right to remain in the UK on the groun of private and family life under Article 8 of the European Convention on Human Rights Children from families receiving support under Section 17 of the Children's Act 1989 who are also subject to a no recourse to public funds restriction Children of a subset of failed asylum seekers supported under Section 4 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 Families holding a BN(O) passport

- Spousal visa holders, work visa holders, student visa holders
- Children of Zambrano and Chen carers
- Those with no immigration status / those who are undocumented

This is not a full list of children who may be eligible, so if you have No Recourse to Public Funds but the above does not apply to you please fill in the application form and contact Reception to discuss further.

If you are legally able to work, your maximum annual household income to qualify should be:

- E22,700 for families outside of London with 1 child
- 225,300 for families outside of London with 2 or more children £31,200 for families within London with 1 child £34,800 for families within London with 1 child
- w to cla

To start claiming Free School Meals for your child/children, please fill in the attached form and return it to the school office. If you are unable to fill it in, the school should be able to assist you.

If possible, please give proof of your immigration status and income. If you do not have proof of immigration status you can still access Free School Meals for your child through self-declaration to the school. Self-declaration could simply include written confirmation from you of your immigration status. An example of this is 7 (name), confirm that I have the following immigration status: (immigration status, e.g. undocumented or spousal viso)*.

Families who do not have the legal right to work in the UK are not required to provide evidence of inc

How will your information be used?

It is not in the Department for Education's process to share information with the Home Office

As set out in the sample application form provided by the Department for Education, applicants agree to provide information for the purpose of it being shared with the Department for Education to assess eligibility for free school meals.

Your school's census returns to the Department for Education will include overall numbers of pupils eligible for Free School Meals so the school can receive the right funding, e.g. Pupil Premium, but will have no indication of pupils immigration status.

On a number of occasions in school we have dealt with issues arising from 'WhatsApp Groups', usually around unkind and inappropriate comments and language. These are dealt with in line with our behaviour policy and children are reminded regularly about both the consequences of online behaviour and how to keep safe online.

Dealing with online behaviour is one level of concern. However, through recently investigating a "WhatsApp Group" including a large number of Chesswood pupils, very significant safeguarding concerns for ALL CHILDREN USING WHATSAPP have arisen. All adults must be aware of the following concerns:-

Any child with the WhatsApp App can be added to ANY group without their consent given

This happens when any member of a group has their number and invites them to join. They are instantly added to the group without consent. We have spoken to children who have been added to completely random groups.

The group may contain children at Chesswood, other schools or <u>any other</u> <u>unknown contacts including adults</u>

The group identified today contained approximately 20 Chesswood pupils (all who had been added) alongside approximately 40 other unknown contacts, some of whom we know have accessed communication with children through other online means.

Once added, the child's number is displayed in the group and is accessible to anyone in that group

We have had it confirmed that this is a method used by adults grooming - collecting numbers, especially of those they see are open to talking to strangers.

WHAT CAN PARENTS DO?

- Recognise that any child on WhatsApp (regardless of their level of understanding of internet safety) are at risk of being added to groups including people that they don't know - thus exposing their personal details (number, name, photo) to strangers
- Remove the WhatsApp App there are clear reasons it is for 16+
 - Check child's phone and online activity at regular intervals


