Key Knowledge—How to draw the human face. Step by Step instructions	Key Vocabulary	
<p>Part One— Demonstrate understanding of the grid structure of the human face by using guidelines to show feature placement.</p> <p>Step 1 —Draw the oval of the face shape ; a vertical line down the centre and a horizontal line down the middle This will help position the eyes.</p> <p>Step 2 — Draw another horizontal line in the middle of the eye guide line and the bottom of the chin. This will be your nose guide line.</p> <p>Step 3 — Draw the another horizontal line in the middle of the nose line and the chin— this will be your mouth line.</p>  	<p>Word</p>	<p>Definition</p>
<p>Part Two—Add the features to your guideline.</p> <p>Step 1 - Shape the eyes and nose line.</p> 	<p>Shading</p>	<p>applied to an object to create a shadow on the opposite side to a light source.</p>
<p>Step 2— Add detail to the eyelids and pupils. From the centre of the pupil, draw vertical lines to position the lips.</p> 	<p>Contour curving shading</p>	<p>the technique which produces an outline.</p>
