Dear Parents

Inset Day – Wednesday 17th May 2023

We will be holding an INSET day at Chesswood on Wednesday 17th May 2023 and plan to arrange childcare facilities, at school, for families who need it.

The details are as follows:

- Wednesday 17th May 2023 - 7:30am to 3:30pm to include breakfast.
- A range of activities will be provided throughout the day, such as art and craft, board and card games, sports, nature documentaries and general play.
- Children will need a packed lunch and a fruit snack. Breakfast will be supplied between 7:30am – 8:15am.
- The cost for the day will be £25.00 per child to be paid in full by Monday 8th May 2023.
- Numbers will be limited and based on a first come first served basis, for paid only bookings (non-refundable)

The children will be cared for throughout the day by members of our school support staff, all of whom are suitably qualified, DBS checked and hold first aid qualifications. Should your children have any allergies or medical conditions, please indicate on the form included.

Should you wish your child to attend, please book online via MCAS (in Trips and Events) or on the slip provided. Where two or more siblings are attending, we will offer a 50% reduction in fees for the second child - please contact finance@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk to arrange this. All bookings must be made no later than 8th May 2023, please.

After School Club role

We are daily collecting a group of children from both Lyndhurst and Springfield Infant Schools to attend our Chesswood After School Club. We need at least two adults to collect from each school every day – approx. ½ hr. Due to a change in staff after Easter it is likely that we will need more adults to help with this. If anyone is interested in becoming involved in our walking bus from either school then please email our School Business Manager in the first instance with an expression of interest. This would be a paid role, supported with thorough training and guidance and subject to normal safeguarding expectations – we will confirm more details once the role(s) become(s) available. Thank you.

After School Club bookings

Our After School Club is proving to be very popular and large numbers of children are attending on a daily basis. This means that we are now at capacity with numbers several days a week and we will therefore be making changes to our booking system after the Easter break so that we can ensure the safety of the children at the Club.

- **All bookings must be made at least 24hrs in advance** – this is so that we have sufficient staffing and resources in place for the sessions
- **There will be a cap on numbers each day** so you may find that sessions are fully booked if not booked far enough in advance – we must restrict numbers due to safety
- If children arrive at After School Club and have not been booked in then we will ring parents and ask that children are collected – they will be unable to join After School Club if the cap has been reached but will be kept safely in school until your arrival.

We understand this may lead to disappointment if you are unable to book your child into After School Club but we are making these changes to ensure your child's safety. We would suggest booking early to secure your place. Thank you.

Help needed

The school has a number of painting & decoration projects in the pipeline over the next 6 months. We would like to offer the opportunity for anyone with links to Chesswood who are professional decorators to quote for some or all of the projects. This is mainly repainting internal walls and skirting boards.

School Meals – New Ordering System

Chartwells are currently contracted by WSCC to provide hot school meals to the school. They are rolling out a new ordering system (ParentPay). The new system will allow you to select a specific meal for your child, this will also ensure they get this at lunchtime.

Due to this, all hot school meals including if your child currently gets a free hot school meal will need to be selected in advance. Children will not be able to choose their own meal at lunchtime and will be served what has been selected in advance.

On the **24th April** all parents will receive a login for the new system from the school. You will then need to order meals for the week beginning the **22nd of May**. Meals before this date will continue to be ordered and paid for using the current meal selector system.

You **MUST** order the exact meal at least 2 weeks in advance for your child on the days you require them to have a hot meal. Medical diets and Lifestyle can be selected at the point of ordering, medical evidence is still required for allergies.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Fortnite may be something of a veteran in gaming terms (having launched back in 2017), but it remains massively popular – with more than 250 million people playing online every month. That's partially due to the competitive nature of its player-vs-player combat, its pop culture crossovers and its constantly shifting map. Significant updates are rolled out with each new version of the game – known as 'chapters' – and within these sit shorter 'seasons', which bring more subtle changes. The latest iteration, Chapter 4 Season 2, adds a cyberpunk-themed city and anime-style areas, for example, along with new weapons and characters.

ALWAYS ONLINE

There's no single-player offline mode in Fortnite: it can only be played online. Internet access can sometimes be an issue when you're out and about (both in terms of connectivity and using up data), so you may find that dedicated young Fortnite players are often less enthusiastic about trips away of a certain length – such as days out and holidays – than you might have expected.

IN-GAME COSTS

Fortnite is free to download and play, but it does offer various additional purchases – cosmetic skins, rare weapons and so on – which don't really impact on gameplay, but can cost quite a significant amount. These items are bought with game's currency, V-Bucks – which can be earned through playing, but are also often purchased from the game's store for real-world money.

POP CULTURE REFERENCES

Part of Fortnite's appeal is its ongoing crossovers with other popular franchises, ranging from movies and TV shows like *The Walking Dead* to comic book characters including Batman to other games such as *Street Fighter*. This means you could find your child asking questions about the creature from *Alien* or who *Geralt* from *The Witcher* is a little sooner than you'd possibly anticipated.

CROSSPLAY AND PARTY CHAT

Fortnite is popular with vast numbers of gamers – of various ages. Crossplay lets friends play with and against each other, regardless of whether they're on an Xbox, PlayStation or PC – while party chat allows them to communicate during the game. This chat feature can also, therefore, put youngsters at risk of hearing inappropriate language from older players in the heat of virtual combat.

VIRTUAL VIOLENCE

At its core, there's no avoiding that Fortnite is about shooting other players to eliminate them. That said, there's no blood or gore: the violence is generally rendered in a cartoonish style, and there are frequent comical touches to lighten the mood (fishing mini-games, for example). The machine guns, shotguns and other weapons often look and behave realistically, however, so discretion is advised.

FREQUENT UPDATES

The game's developers release content in 'seasons' that usually run for around ten weeks. Each fresh update sees items added to the in-game store, changes to the environment's map and a different over-arching theme (such as 'medieval', 'pirates' or 'party'). These regular renewals help to hold players' interest – but also give young gamers plenty of reasons to keep returning to their screens.

Advice for Parents & Carers

MATCH GAMING TIMES

Younger players tend to want to play Fortnite alongside their friends. With this in mind, it could be worth speaking to the parents and carers of your child's social group and trying to coordinate their gaming around certain hours of the day. Safety in numbers is obviously a factor here, but it will also help your child feel that they're getting adequate opportunity to socialise with their friends online.

SET SPENDING LIMITS

Fortnite's rotating store is a not-so-subtle mechanism for coaxing players into splashing out on those sought-after items before they disappear again for weeks. This could potentially lead to surprise outlays on your card if your child is tempted into an impulse purchase. You could consider setting up a prepaid card for them to use – or ensuring that any online purchases require adult authorisation.

USE UPDATES AS REWARDS

Fortnite's seasonal updates are free – but each also brings the option of a 'battle pass', unlocking exclusive rewards for playing the game and completing set challenges. This passes cost around £8 (and are available as part of larger bundles) and can be an effective reward to young Fortnite fans for good behaviour or academic performance, or as an incentive for chores like tidying their room.

BE WARY OF SCAMS

The immense popularity of Fortnite with more trusting younger audiences means that there's no shortage of scammers looking to fraudulently obtain passwords and other personal data through techniques like phishing. As the developers point out on many of Fortnite's loading screens, they never ask for a player's account password outside of the game: make sure your child knows this.

ENJOY FORTNITE TOGETHER

Fortnite also offers split-screen gameplay, meaning that two people can play simultaneously via the same TV or computer. That's ideal for siblings or when your child's friends visit – but it also offers you an opportunity to spend time doing something fun with your child, while also being able to make sure they're playing the game safely. Who knows, you might even teach them a thing or two!

PUPIL PREMIUM

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

Could you and your child be ENTITLED to help with costs towards clubs/trips/receive food vouchers/free holiday activity clubs during school holidays and free school meals?

If you meet any of the following criteria, then you could be entitled:

- **Income Support**
- **Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance**
- **Income-related Employment and Support Allowance**
- **Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999**
- **Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)**
- **Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit**
- **Universal Credit – if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)**

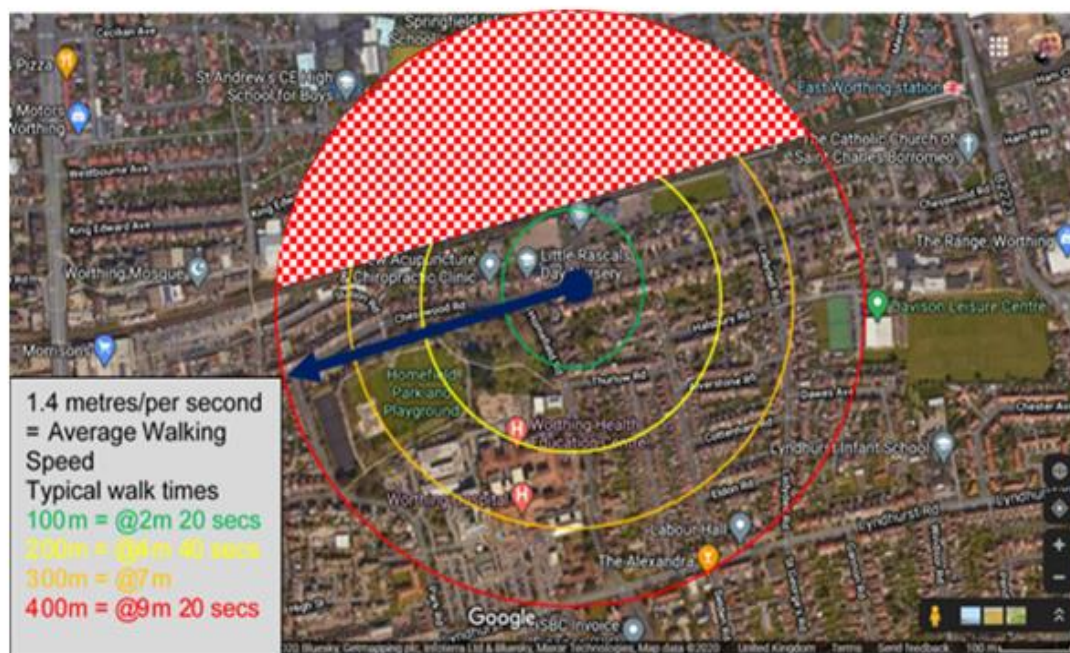

Single Point of Access

The West Sussex Single Point of Access (SPoA) is a dedicated service which provides a simplified single route to access specialist emotional wellbeing and mental health support. The SPoA helps direct you to the right service at the right time, eliminating the need for you to refer to multiple services. Led by Sussex Partnership NHS Foundation Trust, the service is delivered in partnership with West Sussex County Council's Youth Emotional Support Service (YES) and YMCA Dialogue e-wellbeing is the digital front door for West Sussex SPoA.

Who can refer to SPoA?

Anyone - children, young people, parents, carers, families, GPs and other professionals.

How does it work?

The SPoA consists of a team of clinical and administrative staff. All referrals received are triaged (prioritised) by SPoA within 72 hours. Referrals that meet the criteria for SPoA will be directed to the most appropriate service to offer treatment and support. The service may offer advice, intervention work, a patient care plan, or a specialist assessment. In some cases, there may also be input from other services too, such as Healthy Child programme or Winton's Wish.

If your referral does not meet the criteria for SPoA, you will be signposted to other services for support, such as Early Help, Health Visits and specialist services.

This process helps to ensure that the first appointment you have is with the right service.

Making a referral

Go to e-wellbeing.co.uk/support and complete the referral form, providing a clear description of the mental health need and the help or advice you are seeking.



Who is the service for?

SPoA accepts referrals for children and young people from the age of four up to a young person's 18th birthday. The young person must also be registered with a West Sussex GP whilst recognising and working within NHS CHUCK regulations (please note: YES will accept referrals for young people who live in West Sussex or go to a West Sussex school).

All Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC) and Asperger's (developmental) referrals need to continue via the current referral routes, unless there is a mental health or emotional wellbeing concern alongside this. Referrals for young people with eating disorders should be made directly to the Sussex Family Eating Disorder Service (STEDS).
