

Does your child or a child you know help to look after a relative with a disability, special needs, illness, mental health condition, or drug or alcohol problem?

Young carers may undertake all sorts of help, support and care activities beyond normal expectations of a child in the same age group i.e. beyond keeping the bed room tidy and helping with some household chores.

Examples of help, support and care activities

- Practical tasks, like cooking, housework and shopping.
- Physical care, such as helping someone out of bed.
- Emotional support, including talking to someone who is distressed.
- Personal care, such as helping someone dress.
- Managing the family budget and collecting prescriptions.
- Helping to give medicine.
- Helping someone communicate.
- Looking after brothers and sisters.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

MONEY MULING

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? Money muling involves individuals — very frequently young people — being recruited to transfer illegally obtained funds into and out of their bank account on behalf of criminals (often without even realising that the kind of activity they've become embrolled in), and usually being allowed to keep a certain amount for themselves. It's essentially a digital form of money loundering. This guide highlights come of the risks associated with money muling, and provides parents and carers with useful tips to help adeguard young people against becoming ensured by this growing online hazard.

LEGAL REPERCUSSIONS

Young people may be tured by the promise of quick, easy money, but by doing so they will become unwitting participants in activities that can have severe legal and financial consequences. Money multing is a serious offence under UK low involvement in such schemes can result in imprisonment and fines (or both). Remember, the threshold for criminal responsibility in the UK is 10 years of loss.

ONLINE RECRUITMENT

Cyber-savvy criminals are increasingly using various entire methods, including social media apps and gaming platforms, in their attempts to recruit young people as potential money mules. The criminals often deploy persuasive, deceptive tactics to gain children's initial interest and attention, then seek to exploit their trust and nalvety.

POSSIBLE EXPLOITATION

Money musing is frequently carried out in tondern with other organised criminal activities such as the drugs trade or human trafficking. Not only is money muling a criminal affence in its own right, therefore, but it could also expose young people to harmful situations as well as potentially putting them in contact with some extremely decreases individuals.

FINANCIAL LOSSES

If they (even unknowingly) transfer funds that are traced back to criminal activities, money mules can foce considerable financial lesses: their bank may freeze their accounts, and they can be held liable for any lifegally obtained funds. People involved in money muling often also find themselves at greater risk of becoming entangled in other forms of criminal financial exploitation and frauct.

LONG-TERM CONSEQUENCES

involvement in money muling can have a lasting negative impact on a young person is reputation, education and employment prospects, and place calcasal strain on their family Rie. A consiction for financial fraud would significantly damage a young person's future apportunities; they could be blacked from opening a bank account, taking out a mentgage or even securing a phone contract.

Advice for Parents & Carers

EDUCATE AND COMMUNICATE

Talk to your child about the risks and consequences of money muling, emphasising the importance of moking informed decisions and seeking guidance if they need it. Create an open, non-juggmental space which encourages them to share their concerns and experiences, ensuring they feel comfortable gatting help if they suspect they may have become involved in money muling.

MONITOR ONLINE ACTIVITIES

If you have concerns, you might want keep a closer than usual eye on your child's online presence, including their profiles on social media and any gaming platforms that they use. These can aften serve as useful early warning systems which might help you to detect any signs of attempted recruitment by criminals or other types of

TALK ABOUT MONEY

Discussions about avoiding being recruited as a money mule are also good opportunities for a refresher with your child about financial responsibility and good money management. It's also a heightly starting point for highlighting the importance of earning their money by honest means and the potential consequences of getting involved in litegal activities, both online and offline.

STAY INFORMED

Criminals' methods and approaches to recruiting young people as money mules frequently evolve to reflect the online landscape. Try to stoy aware of criminals' current tactics and make time to regularly check out resources provided by schools, law enforcement and financial arganisations. The Don't Be Fooled Campaign (at www.moneymules.co.uk) has plenty of useful information and advice.




REPORT YOUR SUSPICIONS

PUPIL PREMIUM ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

Could you and your child be ENTITLED to help with costs towards clubs/trips/receive food vouchers/ free holiday activity clubs during school holidays and free school meals?

If you meet any of the following criteria, then you could be entitled:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
