



Young Carers

Does your child or a child you know help to look after a relative with a disability, special needs, illness, mental health condition, or drug or alcohol problem?

Young carers may undertake all sorts of help, support and care activities beyond normal expectations of a child in the same age group i.e. beyond keeping the bed room tidy and helping with some household chores.

Examples of help, support and care activities

- Practical tasks, like cooking, housework and shopping.
- Physical care, such as helping someone out of bed.
- Emotional support, including talking to someone who is distressed.
- Personal care, such as helping someone dress.
- Managing the family budget and collecting prescriptions.
- Helping to give medicine.
- Helping someone communicate.
- Looking after brothers and sisters.

Dear Parent,

Strike Action 5th July

I am writing to confirm that children currently in Y3, 4 and 5 should ALL attend school on Wednesday 5th July. It is expected that there will be some strike action on transition day. However, given the complexity arrangements within and between schools, these are the 'least worst' arrangements that we can secure in the circumstances. On that basis, some children (we do not know which at this stage) will not have their new teacher available on the day but will complete broadly the same activities. Families can be assured, we will make further arrangements in the coming weeks to ensure any teacher taking strike action meets their class.

ALL children in Y2 enrolling at Chesswood will attend Wednesday 5th July. All teachers in this team have confirmed they intend to report for work to complete the transition arrangements

Children currently in Y6, enrolling at any local secondary school (with the exception Bohunt High School) will attend that school following the arrangements sent directly to families by that school.

Children enrolling at Bohunt will attend Chesswood on Wednesday 5th July and Bohunt Thursday 6th July.

Please note: All clubs and interventions will take place as normal on this day.

Strike Action 7th July

We will return to our normal strike communication in advance of Friday 7th July. Parents will receive confirmation of classes open and closed on afternoon of Wednesday 5th July.

Please note: All clubs and interventions will be cancelled on this day.

School Performance

Please accept my apologies, it is no longer possible to use Thursday 13th July for the school performance as critical staff cannot be available. Instead, that performance has now been arranged for Friday 14th July 4p.m. All children in the play will need to remain at school and attend Friday 14th July.



What Parents & Carers Need to Know about VIRTUAL FRIENDS



CONTENT AND

Al chabots may not always be able to recognize when content is age inappropriate or hormful and should be fittered out. So there's a possibility that children could be exposed to offensive language or explicit moterial while conversing with their virtual friend. The companies producing such Al solutions are also unlikely to take responsibility for any content that their algorithms generate.

AL

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REDUCED SOCIAL CONTACT

An excessive reliance on chotbots for social interaction could potentially cause a child to begin reducing the annount of face-to-face communication they have, leading to social isolation. If young people become dependent on chotbots to provide companionship, it could very likely hinder the development of their red-file social skills.



Chatbot software isn't always sophisticated enough to pick up on subtle emotional cuies or recognize signs of distress in children, as most humans would. It might therefore fail to respond appropriately. Al misinterpreting what it's being toid or replying insensitively to a young user who's already strugging could potentially impact a child e emotional wellbeing or expondate.

evelopment over the last six months, with companies releasing new Al-based software or odding or rement to existing apps (such as Snopchat, for example). One form of Al to become especially popul has been the "Al friend" or chatbot, as children eagerly experiment with these new found computer - generated companions. There are new turnerous approxisiable with this virtual friend functionality, with the likelihood of it being added to other successful platforms soon.

> UNINTENTIONAL BIAS

Al companions are only as reliable as the information they've been programmed with. The algorithms they use, therefore, may unintentionally promote blas, stereotypes or discriminatory behaviour (as many originate from the UKA or the UK, for instance, they can display a distinctly western-centric worldview). This could lead to children developing axewed attitudes and behaviours.

COGNITIVE

Although many are new underlabble advanced, Ai-powered chatbots still have limitations in terms of understanding complex concepts, context and nuance. Depending neavily on chatbots to help with learning or solving problems may stunt the development of a child's own powers of critical thinking, creativity and ability to engage in open-ended discussions with other people.

PRIVACY

Chattoots typically collect data about users, including personal information and conversations. This is astansibly to improve their performance as they gradually learn about our behaviour - but many expants are woming that there may be significant risks associated with how this information is stored and used (the possibility of potential breaches or misuse by third parties, for

If your child is already expressing an interest in All oppe, a relaxed, natural chat should help you to allocover which eres they're aware of and haw they're using them (or are planning to). Once you're totally happy, you caud sit with your young one and begin exploring Al chatboat together.

TAKE CONTROL

As with any form of app or game, when it comes to Al chatbats we'd strongly recommend that you consider employing parental controls (either on the device being used or within the software itself) to manage which apps your child can download and use. This is particularly important for younger children, who may be more at risk of being upset or frightened by inappropriate content.

RECOGNISE THE RISKS

It's unlikely that most chainten will have even considered the potential risks attached to having a virtual companion. 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

PUPIL PREMIUM ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

Could you and your child be ENTITLED to help with costs towards clubs/trips/receive food vouchers/ free holiday activity clubs during school holidays and free school meals?

If you meet any of the following criteria, then you could be entitled:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)



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
