

Year 6 STEM and Science of Magic Workshops, Coastal Walk and Film

Dear Paren

Whilst some children are away at Bristol, we have planned a wonderful week of enrichment for children staying at Chesswood, including two trips, workshops and a creative competition.

On the morning of Monday 25th September, we will be visited by a local animation company who will be introducing pupils to a week-long competition to create their own stop-gap animation. They will return on the Friday to judge the entries and present the prizes.

On Tuesday, we will be visited by a local magician (David Croucher) who will run a Science of Magic workshop where pupils can learn about how to do different magic tricks. This will be followed by a Magic Show. Ali Khan from STEM innovation will also be joining us to run a workshop entitled Sphero Ball Maze. Here pupils will build their own car and use code to navigate their way around the maze.

We are also taking part in a coastal walk on Wednesday 27th September where, weather permitting, pupils will walk from Chesswood to Shoreham Fort and take the train home. This is a great opportunity to explore the local area and how the coast has been used over time. 1. Development of a sensory room, £6000.

- Helping someone communicate.

Kids eat free over the summer



Tesco is offering free kids' meals to Clubcard holders with any item purchased in 311 of its cafés. Free meals include the kids breakfast, kids hot meal deal and kids cold pick and mix deal. Parents can spend as little as 60p on a piece of fresh fruit for the kids to eat for free.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Developed in Germany, this social networking app is called "W App' in the Apple Store and Google Play but is also branded as a Staro-negativity" zone, it asks users to connect with others from their school. They are then asked a positive question (such as "Who is the nicest person?") and shown four people from their school to choose from.

All users from a school can appear in the polt not just those a child is friends with. The app is mainly anonymous — but does offer clues to reveal who selected you for each question.
