MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

This email is a reminder of the school's policy on the administration of prescribed and non-prescribed medication to pupils, based on guidance and regulations issued by Dept of Health.

FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL PUPILS, CHILDREN SHOULD NEVER CARRY MEDICATION (INCLUDING THROAT SWEETS) ON THEIR PERSON OR IN THEIR SCHOOL BAGS. ALL MEDICATION MUST BE HANDED IN TO THE SCHOOL OFFICE.

Prescribed medication

In most circumstances, medication (e.g. antibiotics) prescribed three times a day can be taken at home

- before school,
- after school
- before bedtime.

However, if your child is required to take prescribed medication four times a day or at set times (such as prior to a meal), clear written instructions must be provided, and the medicine must be kept in a properly labelled container.

The label must be clear and free from alterations or defacement and must show:

- The name of the medication
- The name of the student
- The dosage
- Specific directions for the medication (not simply "as directed" or "as required")
- The name of the dispensing pharmacist/doctor
- The expiry date and the date of issue

A parental agreement form for administering prescribed medication must be completed prior to the medication being administered. The form can be found on our website:

ABSENCE REPORTING

If your child is absent from school for any reason, (including medical appointments) please report their absent via our online Reporting Sickness Absence form. The absence reporting form can be accessed by clicking [HERE](#) or by visiting the school website:

HOME > PARENTS > ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY > REPORTING SICKNESS ABSENCE

Their absence should be reported by 9.00am each day of their absence.

Your message should clearly state:

- Child's name
- Class
- Reason for absence (if illness please specify the nature of the illness)

If the school does not receive a reason for your child's absence, we will call home to confirm a reason. If we are unable to contact you for confirmation, we will log the absence as unauthorised.

If you repeatedly fail to inform the school, why your child is absent we will follow up as a child missing in education/safeguarding concern.



Transfer to Secondary School – September 2024

You have been sent this letter because your child needs to change school at the end of this academic year and it contains information about applying for a **secondary** school place for September 2024.

If your child has an Education Health Care Plan, or you are resident outside West Sussex, different arrangements apply. Please see overleaf.

This letter contains important information about applying online and the benefits of doing so. We strongly recommend that you keep the letter safe until after you have received confirmation of your child's school place for September 2024. We have also enclosed with this letter a checklist of actions parents need to consider before submitting your preferences, we hope you find it useful. To check the catchment school for your address please go to www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions.

Apply online from Monday 4 September 2023

It is easy and safe to apply for a **secondary** school place online by logging on to www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions. Please read the relevant pages on the website before you begin your application. Please be aware that the email address that you provide will be shared with the allocated and preference schools, as parents and schools increasingly communicate electronically.

If you do not have access to the internet, either at home or at work, free internet access to make school applications is available at all West Sussex libraries and Children and Family Centres.

Preparing to make an online application

To make an application using the online system you will need an email address, and to create a password if you do not already have an account on parent portal.

The username will be your email address.

The password must adhere to the following rules, it must be:

- At least 8 characters long

- At least one character UPPERCASE
- At least one character lowercase
- At least one special character (i.e. * ! \$ not a number or letter)
- At least one number

The deadline for receipt of all applications is Tuesday 31 October 2023.

If you have to apply using a paper form, please telephone 03330 142 903 to request one. It is your responsibility to ensure the form is received by your local primary school or the Pupil Admissions Team by 31st October 2023. If sending to the Pupil Admissions Team, the application should be sent using recorded delivery. Parents should note that schools are closed for half term between 23rd and 27th October and will be unable to take receipt of forms during this period. You may also wish to check if your local school will be closed for an INSET day before or after half term. Any application received after the deadline will be considered as out of time or late and will not be processed until after all on time applications. The Pupil Admissions Team will not acknowledge receipt of paper forms and you must ensure you provide a valid e-mail address with your application to receive the outcome of your school offer.

You can express up to three preferences for secondary schools. All your preferences will be considered against the oversubscription criteria of your preferred schools. If your child can be offered a place at more than one school listed on the application, they will be offered a place at the higher listed school. Please do not put down the same preference more than once as your child can only be ranked once for each preferred school. Please do not include independent schools, schools where you do not want a place for your child or Elective Home Education as preferences.

- Children with Education Health Care Plans:** parents should already have been contacted by the Special Educational Needs Assessment Team (SENAT). If you have not, please contact them using the details shown on our website or call the telephone number above.
- Children resident outside West Sussex:** parents are required to complete a transfer application through the local authority responsible for their address, even if the preference is for a school in another local authority's area. If you have any questions, please contact your local authority, or visit their website for information on how to apply.

If you wish your child to be considered for a place at their catchment school, you must include this as one of your three preferences.

We look forward to receiving your online application before the **national closing date of Tuesday 31 October 2023**. The national allocation date is Friday 01 March 2024 and parents who provide a valid e-mail address with their application will be sent an email advising of the school offered to their child on this day.

Year 6 STEM and Science of Magic Workshops, Coastal Walk and Film Event

Dear Parent

Whilst some children are away at Bristol, we have planned a wonderful week of enrichment for children staying at Chesswood, including two trips, workshops and a creative competition.

On the morning of Monday 25th September, we will be visited by a local animation company who will be introducing pupils to a week-long competition to create their own stop-gap animation. They will return on the Friday to judge the entries and present the prizes.

On Tuesday, we will be visited by a local magician (David Croucher) who will run a Science of Magic workshop where pupils can learn about how to do different magic tricks. This will be followed by a Magic Show. Ali Khan from STEM Innovation will also be joining us to run a workshop entitled Sphero Ball Maze. Here pupils will build their own car and use code to navigate their way around the maze.

We are also taking part in a coastal walk on Wednesday 27th September where, weather permitting, pupils will walk from Chesswood to Shoreham Fort and take the train home. This is a great opportunity to explore the local area and how the coast has been used over time. We will be having lunch on the walk and children will need to bring a packed lunch for the day as well as a snack.

We will be walking down to the Dome Cinema on Thursday morning to watch a film (film to be confirmed.) Pupils are encouraged to bring their water bottles.

On both days out (Tuesday and Thursday) the children can wear their **PE kit or school uniform**. Trainers or sensible shoes must be worn.

We are asking parents/carers to make a voluntary contribution of £11.00 to cover the cost of the STEM and magic workshops and train fares and ensure these events can proceed. Year 4 – Weald & Downland Museum trip - October 2023

As part of our History topic of 'Were the Dark Ages Dark?', we intend to take Y4 pupils to the Weald and Downland Museum in order to study how people lived in Anglo-Saxon times. During the visit children will attend two workshops:

At Home with the Anglo Saxons
 Anglo Saxons artefacts

We will be leaving Chesswood at 9am and returning at approximately 3.30pm/3.45pm. The trip will take place over two days:

Tuesday 17th October 2023 – 4LB and 4CH

Zoolab will bring a selection of relevant animals into Chesswood which the children will observe and have the opportunity to handle if they would like to. Through this, our science topic will come to life and provide a real life context to further enhance their learning.

Year 3 Visit by Worthing Museum Outreach – 14th, 16th & 17th November 2023

As part of our 'Stones and Bones' topic we have arranged a visit from Worthing Museum who will run a workshop with the children. The workshop will help the children to understand how we know what happened in the past with a particular focus on archaeology and they will develop a better understanding of The Stone Age. Each class will have the opportunity to participate in a set of activities, which include handling artefacts, an archaeological dig and map work.

The total cost of the visits to the school is **£10.00** per pupil (these will show as two separate trips on MCAS but can be paid for at the same time). We are asking parents/carers to make a voluntary contribution of £10.00 to cover our expenses and ensure that the visit can proceed. 

It will then close and decisions will be taken regarding the installation of additional road safety measures including a four way crossing and a school street vastly improving child and family safety.

Background

In September 2020, school leaders requested feedback from all families about their experiences travelling to and from school, particularly their experience of safety for children on the Ladydell road section at the end of the school field and the Ladydell/ Chesswood Road crossing. The concerns from families were stark - over one third reporting they had had near misses at the locations

above. Two thirds believed the areas were either very or extremely unsafe. Since that time we have worked with a wide range of officials, officers and councillors to raise the issues and seek to reduce the safety risk for children and families. The result has been some initial work in Ladydell road. However, the important work of an installing a crossing is next. IF there is enough COMMUNITY SUPPORT from families it will increase the likelihood of securing this critical safety crossing. As a result of the concerns shared by families, we hope ALL families will complete the POLL and SUPPORT the installation of the crossing. Gaining the SUPPORT of all families at Chesswood will provide the best chance for it to go ahead and to vastly improve the safety of children for years to come. PLEASE follow the links below to SUPPORT this vital project. Without overwhelming support and your action completing the POLL the project may well not go ahead.

Top Tips for SETTING BOUNDARIES AROUND GAMING

If your child loves video games, then you'll probably be aware that how long they spend gaming – and what they're actually playing – can occasionally become a source of concern or conflict. The UK's trade body for interactive entertainment, Ukie, has recently launched a campaign to promote safer and more responsible gaming among young people – with parents and carers helping by setting sensible and fair boundaries. Our guide has tips on key areas where you could agree some healthy ground rules for your child's gaming activity.

PROMOTE SAFER GAME CHOICES

Deciding which online games are OK – and which should be avoided – is tricky. Some titles allow children to cooperate or compete with strangers, which creates potential risks. Watching your child play online for a while could provide more insight into a particular game, while the parental controls on most consoles allow you to limit who can chat to your child or send them friend requests. Remind your child of the hazards around strangers online when you discuss this boundary with them.

ENCOURAGE REGULAR BREAKS

Help your child understand the need to take regular breaks, playing in shorter bursts rather than marathon sessions. Bear in mind that some games (such as role-playing games) require time investment from the player, while others (online team games, for example) can't be stopped or paused at a moment's notice. A quick break every hour or so is good practice, and you could suggest some things to do in these breaks, such as having a drink of water or getting some fresh air.

AGREE SPENDING LIMITS

There's no doubt that gaming can be expensive, and younger players often don't realise how much paying for digital items and subscriptions can add up to. Many young gamers love to buy new skins or upgrades for their character, so you could settle on a fixed amount that your child is allowed to spend on in-game items each week or month. This sort of boundary will not only help your child to manage their expectations but will also make you more aware of the price of these items.

DISCUSS AGE RATINGS

Children often ignore the age ratings on games – or are unaware they even exist. If you're happy with your child playing a particular game even though it's rated above their age, then establish that as a boundary, emphasise that you've made an exception, and talk about what age ratings mean and why they're important. You could add context to this boundary by browsing games' boxes together while shopping, discussing why some games might have earned certain age ratings.

FACTOR IN FRIENDS

If your child is a keen video gamer, the chances are that they'll have other gamers among their social circle, too. When friends visit, do they instantly dash to their console or computer? You could put boundaries in place before their guests arrive by agreeing on a length of gaming time. Bear in mind, though, that they may try to extend this once they're together. Try coming up with activities or challenges for them during screen breaks – if they join in, they earn a little extra time on their game.

ENJOY GAMING TOGETHER

Setting time aside to play video games together can be an enjoyable bonding exercise. Undoubtedly, some young gamers may be less enthusiastic about a parent or carer joining in, but it can be a productive way of encouraging them to share their hobby with you. Setting goals or tasks might be useful if they love Minecraft, choose something to build together; if Fortnite's their favourite, ask to try out some of the fun game modes, like Prop Hunt, which don't require high skill levels.

TALK ABOUT EMOTIONS

Help your child to monitor their emotions as they play. Discuss what is (and isn't) an acceptable level of competitiveness to show while gaming. Are they allowed to trash talk other players, for example? Can they notice when they get angry if they lose? Do they think these emotions are healthy? Some games can provoke anger, but others can bring joy, humour and the thrill of overcoming a challenge. Try to steer your child towards games that tend to produce these more positive feelings.

BE PREPARED FOR TROLLS

A frequent problem when gaming online is other players who are deliberately troublesome. Make sure your child knows how to report and block someone who makes their experience a negative one. Between you, decide if or how they should deal with these online trolls. Talk about where your child's boundaries are in terms of what they think is acceptable: what behaviour by other users is merely frustrating, and what crosses the line to become upsetting or abusive.


