MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

This email is a reminder of the school's policy on the administration of prescribed and non-prescribed medication to pupils, based on guidance and regulations issued by Dept of Health.

FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL PUPILS, CHILDREN SHOULD NEVER CARRY MEDICATION (INCLUDING THROAT SWEETS) ON THEIR PERSON OR IN THEIR SCHOOL BAGS. ALL MEDICATION MUST BE HANDED IN TO THE SCHOOL OFFICE.

Prescribed medication

In most circumstances, medication (e.g. antibiotics) prescribed three times a day can be taken at home

- before school,
- after school
- before bedtime.

However, if your child is required to take prescribed medication four times a day or at set times (such as prior to a meal), clear written instructions must be provided, and the medicine must be kept in a properly labelled container.

The label must be clear and free from alterations or defacement and must show:

- The name of the medication
- The name of the student
- The dosage
- Specific directions for the medication (not simply "as directed" or "as required")
- The name of the dispensing pharmacist/doctor
- The expiry date and the date of issue

A parental agreement form for administering prescribed medication must be completed prior to the medication being administered. The form can be found on our website:

ABSENCE REPORTING

If your child is absent from school for any reason, (including medical appointments) please report their absent via our online Reporting Sickness Absence form. The absence reporting form can be accessed by clicking <u>HERE</u> or by visiting the school website:

Their absence should be reported by 9.00am each day of their absence.

Your message should clearly state:

- Child's name
- Class
- Reason for absence (if illness please specify the nature of the illness)

If the school does not receive a reason for your child's absence, we will call home to confirm a reason. If we are unable to contact you for confirmation, we will log the absence as unauthorised.

If you repeatedly fail to inform the school, why your child is absent we will follow up as a child missing in education/safeguarding concern.

If your child has an Education Health Care Plan, or you are resident outside West Sussex, different arrangements apply. Please see overleaf.

This letter contains important information about applying online and the benefits of doing so. We strongly recommend that you keep the letter safe until after you have received confirmation of your child's school place for September 2024. We have also enclosed with this letter a checklist of actions parents need to consider before submitting your preferences, we hope you find it useful. Apply online from Monday 4 September 2023

It is easy and safe to apply for a <u>secondary</u> school place online by logging on to www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions. Please read the relevant pages on the website before you begin your application. Please be aware that the email address that you provide will be shared with the allocated and preference schools, as parents and schools increasingly communicate electronically.

If you do not have access to the internet, either at home or at work, free internet access to make school applications is available at all West Sussex libraries and Children and Family Centres.

Preparing to make an online application

To make an application using the online system you will need an email address, and to create a password if you do not already have an account on parent portal.

The username will be your email address.

The password must adhere to the following rules, it must be: • At least 8 characters long

- At least one character UPPERCASE

The deadline for receipt of all applications is Tuesday 31 October 2023.

You can express up to three preferences for secondary schools. All your preferences will be considered against the oversubscription criteria of your preferred schools. If your child can be offered a place at more than one school listed on the application, they will be offered a place at the higher listed school. Please do not put down the same preference more than once as your child can only be ranked once for each preferred school. Please do not include independent schools, schools where you do not want a place for your child or Elective Home Education as preferences

- Children with Education Health Care Plans: parents should already have been contacted by the Special Educational Needs Assessment Team (SENAT). If you have not, please contact them using the details shown on our website or call the telephone number above.
- · Children resident outside West Sussex: parents are required to complete a It ransfer application through the local authority responsible for their address, even if the preference is for a school in another local authority's area. If you have any questions, please contact your local authority, or visit their website for information on how to apply.

Year 6 STEM and Science of Magic Workshops, Coastal Walk and Film Event

Dear Parent

Whilst some children are away at Bristol, we have planned a wonderful week of enrichment for children staying at Chesswood, including two trips, workshops and a creative competition.

On the morning of Monday 25th September, we will be visited by a local animation company who will be introducing pupils to a week-long competition to create their own stop-gap animation. They will return on the Friday to judge the entries and present the prizes.

On Tuesday, we will be visited by a local magician (David Croucher) who will run a Science of Magic workshop where pupils can learn about how to do different magic tricks. This will be followed by a Magic Show. Ali Khan from STEM Innovation will also be joining us to run a workshop entitled Sphero Ball Maze. Here pupils will build their own car and use code to navigate their way around the maze.

We are also taking part in a coastal walk on Wednesday 27th September where, weather permitting, pupils will walk from Chesswood to Shoreham Fort and take the train home. This is a great opportunity to explore the local area and how the coast has been used over time. We will be having lunch on the walk and children will need to bring a packed lunch for the day as well as a snack.

We will be walking down to the Dome Cinema on Thursday morning to watch a film (film to be confirmed.) Pupils are encouraged to bring their water bottles,

On both days out (Tuesday and Thursday) the children can wear their PE kit or school uniform. Trainers or sensible shoes must be worn.

Year 4 - Weald & Downland Museum trip - October 2023

As part of our History topic of Were the Dark Ages Dark?', we intend to take Y4 pupils to the Weald and Downland Museum in order to study how people lived in Anglo-Saxon times. During the visit children will attend two orkshops:

Year 3 Visit by Zoolab – 29th September 2023

Parenting your child in anxious times – a five-week course for parents and carers of primary children.

Dear parent/carer,

We are contacting you from Thought-Full, the West Sussex Mental Health Support Team in Schools, to offer you the opportunity to attend our parent support group focussing on supporting children with fears and worries.

The sessions are suitable for any parents who would like some guidance and ideas about how best to support their child's emotional wellbeing but would be particularly suitable for those whose children experience fears and worries.

The five sessions will take place at school and will be led by mental health professionals who are experienced in supporting children and families with emotional wellbeing and mental health.

Thursday 14th March @ 9am

Thursday 21st March @ 9am

The five sessions will consist of:

- 1. Understanding anxiety an introduction to the biological function of anxiety.
- Supporting your child with anxiety and worries: 1 this session explores what keeps anxiety going and the strategies you can use to support your child.
- Supporting your child with anxiety and worries: 2 further discussion of approaches to support an anxious child including our use of language and the PACE approach (playfulness, acceptance, <u>curiosity</u> and empathy).
- An introduction to emotion coaching a step by step approach to helping your child to learn about emotions and how to deal with them.
- Encouraging resilience exploring how we can support anxious children to build their resilience and grow into adults who can cope with life's ups and downs.

The sessions will be informal with plenty of opportunity for discussion, asking questions, and sharing your ideas and experiences with other parents. There may be different strategies you would like to try out at home after the sessions, but there is no set <u>homework</u> and we would just ask that parents and carers come with an open mind and a willingness to look at things from new perspectives.



EVOLVING SCAMS

WHAT ARE

THE RISKS?

WhatsApp's popularity makes it a lucrative hunsing ground for scammers. Recent examples include posing as the target's child, requesting a maney transfer because of a spunious 'emergency'. Plus a scam where fraudsters trigger a verification message by attempting to log in to your account, then (posing as WhatsApp) call or toxt to ask you to repeat the code back to them, giving them access.

CONTACT FROM STRANGERS

To stort a chat, someone only needs the makine number of the WrietsApp user that they want to message. If your child has ever given their number out to someone they don't know, that person could then contract them vio WhatsApp. It's also possible that your child might be added to a group chat (by one of their friends, for example) containing other people that thew don't know.

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FAKE NEWS

WhatsApp's connectivity and ease of use allows news to be shared rapidly - whether it's true or not. To combat the spread of misinformation, messages forwarded more than five times on the app now display a "Torwarded many limes" label and a double

arrow icon. This makes users aware that the message they've just received is far from an original _ and might not be entirely factual, either.



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VIEW ONCE

The facility to send images or messages that can only be viewed once has led to some WhatApp users sharing inappropriate images or obusive texts, knowing that the recipient can't re-open them later to use as evidence of misconduct. People used to be able to screensho this 'disoppeoring' content - but a recently added WhatApp feature how blocks this, stiring increased privacy.



Another new option allows users to store certain messages or chats in a separate facked chars fidder, saved behind a passcode, lingerprint or face 10 outhentication The risk here is that this function or eates the potential for young people to hide conversions and content that they suspect their parents wouldn't opprove of (such as age-inappropriate material).

VISIBLE LOCATION

Whatsapp's live location feature teks users share their current whereabouts, which can be helpful for friends meeting up or parents checking that their child's sately on the way home, for example. However, anyone in your child's contacts list or in a mutual group chat can also track their location – potentially letting strangers identify o child's home address or journeys that they make readents.

Advice for Parents & Carers ... TYPING...

EMPHASISE CAUTION

Encourage your child to treat unexpected messages with caution: get them to consider, for example, whether the message sounds like something a triend or relative would really send them. Make sure they know never to share personal details over WhatsApp, and to be wary at discing on any links in messages. Setting up two-step verification adds a further layer of protection to their WhatsApp account.

ADJUST THE SETTINGS

A REAL PROPERTY.

It's wise to change your child's WhatsApp settings (go to 'Privacy', then 'Groups') to specify which of their contacts can add them to group chats without needing approval; you can give permission to My Contacts' or 'My Contacts Except ...'. Additionally, if your child needs to use 'live location', emphasise that they should enable this function for only as long as they need – and then turn it aff.

THINKING BEFORE SHARING

Help your child to understand why it's important to stop and think before posting or forwarding something on WhatsApp. It's easy – and all too common – for content to then be shared more widely (aven publicly on social media). Encourage your child to consider how an ill-judged message might damage their reputation or upset a friend who sent something to them in confidence.

CHAT ABOUT PRIVACY

Some parents like to check in with their child about how they're using WhatsApp, explaining that it will help to keep them safe. If you spot a 'locked Chats' folder, you might want to talk about the sort of chats that are in there, who they're with and why your child wants to keep them hidden. 





