
National Numeracy Day – Wednesday 22nd May


STEM Workshop – different date/time per year group w/b Monday 20th May

Dear Parents,

We are excited to confirm that Chesswood will be celebrating Maths during the week beginning Monday 20th May as part of National Numeracy Day celebrations on Wednesday 22nd May. The aim of National Numeracy Day is to celebrate numbers and how we use them in everyday life. The day is designed to encourage people to feel curious about numbers, explore how they can benefit them in their day-to-day life and give them the confidence to develop and improve their numeracy skills. We are taking the week as an opportunity to celebrate Maths with the focus being 'Where is the Maths?' **Our main form of celebration will be for children (and staff) to come to school dressed as a number on Tuesday 21st May.** This could include a top that has numbers on it already, for instance a football shirt or may be a specially designed top containing calculations.


How can children get involved?

There are a number of optional tasks for children to participate in, mainly across the week beginning Monday 20th May, however, feel free to attempt these at an alternative time if it's more convenient. In addition to dressing as a number on Tuesday 21st May, other tasks include:

- We will be running a TT Rock Stars Battle of the Bands competition from Monday 20th May to Friday 24th May. Every question answered on TT during this week counts – there will be certificates and house points awarded to the children who answer the most questions.
- Take part in the National Numeracy Day – Number Heroes Competition. To enter, create a picture of yourself doing your dream job or hobby – you can draw, paint, collage, use a computer, or use any other way you'd like to create your picture! You can use the Number Hero Sheet included in this letter to design your entry on. Winners will be picked based on the most imaginative picture, showing great effort and the most creative uses for numbers. - Complete any of the National Numeracy Day activities – these include rapping, dancing, money activities and baking fun! - On Wednesday 22nd May – As this is an Inset Day and children won't be at school on National Numeracy Day itself, we would like children to look for opportunities of finding Maths at home or when they are out and about. Examples could include numbers on a clock or on an oven. You may see some shapes on some wallpaper or curtains - there are so many possibilities. Send in your photos/videos of Maths at home to Mr Gilbert via ngilbert@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk. Children may wish to use this day to work on their design for the Number Heroes competition.
