Advice for Parents & Carers ... TYPING...

EMPHASISE CAUTION

Encourage your child to treat unexpected messages with caution: get them to consider, for example, whether the messages sounds like something a friend or relative would really send them. ADJUST THE SETTINGS

THINKING BEFORE SHARING

Help your child to understand why it's important to stop and think before posting or forwarding something on WhatsApp. It's easy — and all too common — for content to then be shared more widely (even publicly on social media). CHAT ABOUT PRNACY

Same parents like to check in with their child about how they're using Whatshapp, explaining that it will help to keep them safe. If you spot a 'Locked Chats' folder, you might want to talk about the sort of chats that are in there, who they're with and why your child wants to keep them hidden. Also, if your child has sent any 'view ance' content, you could discuss their reasons for using this feature.


