I am writing on behalf of Shoreham RNLI Lifeboat Station to see if you would be able to help support us in the RNLI's 200th year, by holding a mufti day to help raise vital funds for us at your school.

The RNLI plays a vital role in water safety and rescue operations, and we believe that raising awareness and funds for our lifesaving work would be a meaningful way for your school community to learn more about us.

In May, the RNLI will launch its annual "Mayday" campaign – our yellow-themed annual fundraiser, which runs from 1-31 May. It's a celebration of the volunteer lifeboat crews who are on call 24 hours a day, every day, to save lives at sea, we feel that this would be the perfect opportunity to collaborate with local schools.
