2. Clerk to the Governors Required - All

Studybugs: This is a downloadable app available for smartphones. On here you are able to put the information onto the app for your child's absence and this will come directly through to the school.

Telephone message: By calling the school on the day of your child's absence the option for Absence is on the main answerphone and this records a message for the office to collect.

Y5/6 WSSA Indoor Athletics Cup Final:



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CASE STUDY

School: Chesswood Junior School Focus: Engaging Less Active Pupils PE Leader: Tim Quick Twitter: @chesswoodschool





Active Sussex will be working with Chesswood Junior School over this academic year to create a series of case studies that will follow the progress of how the school is engaging pupils identified as less active. The three case studies will link with the new OFSTED framework with each case study focussing on one of the 'three Is': Intent, Implementation and Impact.

About the School

Chesswood Junior School in Worthing is a 5/6 form entry school consisting of approximately 650 pupils spread over 22 classes. The pupil population at Chesswood is diverse, with approximately 23% PP and 18% SEN. The school's mission is to "inspire the whole school community to enjoy their learning adventure and have fun along the way."

Tim Quick coordinates PE and sport at the school and has worked there for 11 years, initially as a classroom teacher and the last 7 as a PE Specialist. Chesswood Junior School has always considered PE and sport a strength of the school, offering approximately 50 extracurricular sports/activity clubs each year. They are also part of both the Worthing School Sports Association (WSSA) and the Southern Area School Games Partnership allowing the school to enter around 60 competitions across the school year. They currently hold the Platinum School Games Mark.

INTENT

This year, Chesswood are aiming to engage more of their less active pupils in physical activity and sport.

Identifying Pupils

Less active pupils have been identified through the school's tracking system that looks at pupil attendance in sport competitions and extracurricular sport/activity clubs.

Less active pupils are deemed by the school as those who have not taken part in either a competition or club in the Autumn term this year (September – end of December). Pupils that didn't attend a club over the last academic year are also studied and added to the list where appropriate.



Chesswood finished third in the 2017/18 Beat the Street programme.

Initial Ideas

The school is currently considering a number of programmes and interventions to encourage this engagement. These include:

- Active Advent a different challenge or activity for pupils to try on each day of December leading up to Christmas.
- Targeted Circuit Club a popular club introduced through an athlete visit by Olympic gymnast, Kelly Sim last year. This year will be promoted specifically to targeted pupils who will gain priority places on the club.
- Summer Fun Activity Club a club that takes a step away from traditional sport clubs and focuses on student led activities and active play with less structure.
- Beat the Street The school came third in the Beat the Street event last year and it was noted that target pupils were engaging in this with their families outside of school time. The school have contacted Tammy Waine, Families and Wellbeing Officer at Adur and Worthing District Council who coordinated the event, to see what other similar programmes could be accessed.

NEXT UP: Implementation

The next case study in this series will focus on what programmes have been put in place by Chesswood and how the school has implemented them.
