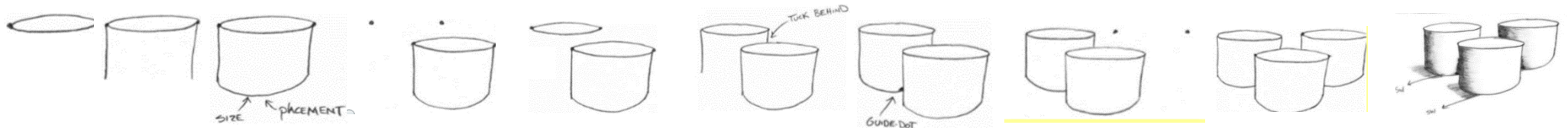


Drawing cylindrical objects



Find some cylindrical objects in your home such as a cup, glass, tin can or Pringle tube. Arrange them on a surface where there is a direct light source, either from a window or inside light. Carefully draw your objects. Think carefully about the size and placement of each object and how they overlap. Add in the shading and blending techniques you learnt in class. Email your teacher a picture of your finished sketch.

Extension

Create your own cylindrical product. Carefully draw a picture then explain what your product is and why you think people would want to buy it. It does not have to be a food product; it could be packaging for example a game or beauty product.

*Size:*

*Draw objects larger to make them look closer, draw them smaller to make them look further away.*

*Placement:*

*Draw objects lower on the surface of the paper to make them look closer, draw them higher to look further away.*

*Overlapping:*

*Draw objects in front of or partially blocking the view of other objects to make them look closer, or draw them tucked behind other objects to look further away.*
