Summer Term Arrangements 2020

Dear Parent,

I am writing to set out arrangements for the summer term. As I do this, I hope you and your family are well and are meeting the very many challenges faced at this time as positively as possible. My team and I hope that the arrangements so far and those we will develop going forwards will be helpful. We are seeking to create the best solutions for the different individual and diverse challenges facing Chesswood Junior School families, particularly in relation to flexible arrangements for learning and maintaining pupil welfare.

Limited Community Opening

We are making arrangements for Summer opening for children. This will be for key workers (Government guidance states: Many parents working in these sectors may be able to ensure their child is kept at home. And every child who can be safely cared for at home must be). Additionally, we are supporting families where there are exceptional needs and respite care is required e.g. Education, Health Care Plan or a child protection plan. This facility will only be open to children where it is 'absolutely necessary' and no other reasonable arrangements are possible. We will accept children for the day in which a key worker attends work or the day after any night shift. Once a child is in school they are welcome to stay all day – that remains the case whether a key workers shift is morning or afternoon only.

If it is 'absolutely necessary' and you are a key worker or you have a child in vulnerable circumstances please complete the online form by Wednesday 22nd April 5p.m., in the first instance, so that we can arrange appropriate staffing for the next three weeks.

Free School Meals

For any children attending school, whether they are eligible or not, they are able to have a Free School Meal during the school closure period. We would encourage all children attending school to take this offer up – there is no application process, simply send child to school without packed lunch.

For any child that is currently eligible for free school meals they are entitled to £15 per week via the Edenred voucher system. We believe that all families entitled to FSM have been contacted and almost all of that group have now received their vouchers. If your child is eligible for free school meals currently and you have not been contacted by one of our office team, please email <u>office@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk</u>. If you have checked your 'junk' mail and contacted Edenred to address any voucher issues and still have not been successful please let us know immediately <u>office@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk</u>.

Please Note: <u>being registered as pupil premium does not automatically qualify for free school meals</u>. Pupil premium consists of three groups – current free school meals; free school meals within the past 6 years and children subject to a care or adoption during their childhood. It is only <u>current free school meals</u> from this group that are eligible. If you believe you child would be eligible please apply at:

Home- School Contact

Starting from Tuesday 21st April class teachers will be contacting families either once per week or once every two weeks depending on the guidance, help and support that may be required. Where children or families require a higher level of support e.g. special education needs or significant pastoral needs; we have allocated a further member from the special educational or pastoral team to contact, in addition to the class teacher, on a more frequent basis. As this is a new system, we will almost certainly need to make adjustments e.g. contacting some families more because of arising need and some families may

be self-sufficient and not require frequent contact.

The phone conversation will focus on the learning experience so far, its success or otherwise. The technology available at home to your child during the school day. Worries and concerns from the parent point of view alongside what is going well. Finally, the teacher would like to have a brief chat with your child (their pupil (3)) to get their perspective on things and hopefully motivate them to keep learning during these challenging times. The call will probably last 5 mins, it will not last more than 10 minutes given the volume of calls required. Should more time be needed, we will determine how best that can be managed e.g. use of SEN or pastoral or IT team. Most calls will be from a 'withheld' number as this is the agreed safeguarding advice for school staff calling from their homes or personal mobiles. Therefore, we will rely on families answering these – our calls will be between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

If you need learning support before we are able to contact you via the phone call, please use the year group email addresses e.g. <u>y3support@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk</u>. Simply add the correct year number (3-6) to the start of the email to contact the year team responsible for your child.

The front page includes two child friendly stories about Corona Virus. It also includes the school 'Regulation Rainbow'. The 'Regulation Rainbow' is designed for children to work through their thoughts, feelings and behaviours with the support of an adult. As children build a conscious understanding of their regulation and dysregulation over time they are more empowered to recognise triggers and responses and are in a better position to take action, sometimes with others to stay in the 'Green Zone'. We would highly recommend any family experiencing difficulties with their child's regulation during this lock down start with the 'regulation rainbow'.

Linked to the main page is a wealth of further support and guidance using national websites such

as 'Every Mind Matters' that provides very clear advice and good habits for adults to build in response to sleeping, anxiety, stress or low mood. It also has a section on helping other with mental health.
