	<p><b>Weekly Task:</b> Do you remember when we wrote narratives in the style of the Daydreamer by Ian McEwan? This week, we are doing a similar narrative about Peter falling into a daydream. This can be whatever you like, but if you are stuck, you could have a toy come to life at his house or go on a mountain adventure on the way to school.</p> <p>I would suggest you follow this structure for the week: Monday – plan; Tuesday – write the beginning; Wednesday – write the middle; Thursday – write the ending; Friday – edit. However, you could also choose to focus on only one part of the story, like the daydream itself.</p>	<p>Use the planning template with prompt questions to help you plan and the success criteria to remind you of the grammar to include. If you forget what any of the grammar means, check IXL, look it up online or use a word mat – just do your best! There is also the model we used in class (with colour-coded grammar) for inspiration (yours doesn't have to be that long!), and an editing success criteria to help you edit.</p> <p>See resources on Monday.
