
Covid-19 Guide

What will school look like and how do I keep myself and others safe?



In the Classroom




All tables are 2 metres apart so you can keep 'social distancing' in class. You will always stay at the same table and even when you're not at school that table will not be used by anyone else.

You will keep your bag under your table.



Sometimes your teacher might teach you through Teams and you'll be able to hear and see them even though they aren't in the room! There will always be another adult in the room with you.

P.E. will take place in your zone and with your bubble and your teachers will lead the activities.



All of the classrooms have a sink so that you can wash your hands regularly. When will you need to wash your hands?

- When you arrive at school
- Before and after break and lunch
 - Before you leave school
 - After you sneeze or cough

Remember to wash your hands with soap for 20 seconds and dry them well!





What if I need to sneeze or cough?

Always do your best to sneeze or cough into your elbow. If you have a tissue the best thing you can do is sneeze or cough into the tissue. Then you need to put the tissue in one of the orange bags in the classroom and then put that bag the bin. Don't forget to wash your hands with soap for 20 seconds after!

If you use a tissue you must then place the tissue into one of these orange bags:




Then you need to tie it up and then put it in the bin.

Don't forget to wash your hands!


Around the School

Around the school you will see arrows taped onto the floor, you must follow the direction of these arrows. You will also see lines taped to the floor. This is to show you how to keep 2 metres away from the person walking in front of you.





In the Year 5/6 building you must wait until there is no one using the stairs before using them yourself. If you are with a group, you must keep 2 metres apart.



Moving around school

- There will be minimal movement around school as you will use external doors to the playgrounds
- We will not be using shared areas eg hall / music room etc
- Follow the one way system where it exists
- Use the lines to keep 2m apart
- All doors will be kept open with door stops to minimise surfaces we have to touch
- Do not go past any 'no entry' signs



When you need to use the toilet, you must first ask your teachers, like you usually would. When you arrive outside of the toilet you need to call in to check if there is someone else in there. Only one person can use the toilet at a time. If there is someone in the toilets you must wait for them to come out before entering. If no one calls back then you are good to go in!



First Aid

If you feel sick or have an injury you will need to tell an adult and they will take you to the Medical Room which is in the Year 4 area. An adult will put on PPE, this will keep both you and them safe as they help you and they will look like this....






Outside Play

It's important to keep 2 metres away from each other at all times, even when you're outside. You'll have your own spaces marked out for you to play in and you can chat with and play noncontact games with your friends, remembering to always keep 2 metres apart.





Sometimes you or others might forget to keep 2 metres so you can gently remind them using your words...
