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3. Chesswood Wrap Around Childcare – All – Information

As mentioned in my recent letter regarding the Autumn Term arrangements, we will be re-opening our Breakfast Club from September 2020 as well as taking over the running of the After School Club.

Both clubs will be run in our New Hall which offers plenty of space for a variety of activities and access to the playground and outside areas.

Breakfast Club runs from 7.30am to 8.30am and will include a breakfast of cereal, toast and fresh fruit. The cost per session is £4 payable in advance. This club will not be open to siblings from other schools.

The After School Club will run from 3.15pm through to 6pm. We will be arranging various activities such as outdoor play, board games, art & craft etc. There will also be access to iPads and quieter zones/times. Snacks will be available including toast and fresh fruit.

There will be a choice of pick up times -

- 3.15pm to 4.15/4.30pm £6 per session
- 3.15pm to 4.45/5pm £8 per session
- 3.15pm to 6pm £10.50 per session

We will also be able to collect younger siblings from Lyndhurst and Springfield Infant Schools in our Minibus (where their older sibling is attending After School Club).

Bookings for both clubs for **current Chesswood pupils** can be made online via SchoolsBuddy or by completing the booking form on our website https://www.chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk/page/?title=Before+and+After+School+Care&pid=193 and paying by cheque.

If you would like a younger **sibling from either Lyndhurst or Springfield** to attend After School Club (with an older child attending from Chesswood) then you will need to please complete the booking form and pay by cheque. We will also need confirmation of which school they attend so that we can arrange collection with that school. At present online booking is not available to children not attending Chesswood but we hope to be able to add this facility in future.

If your **child is due to start at Chesswood in September** they will not currently be on our SchoolsBuddy system. Please would you therefore complete the booking form and pay by cheque for this half term (or those sessions you are currently booking). Your child will be added to our system at the start of the school term and any future bookings may be made via SchoolsBuddy.

4. Secondary School Transfer - Current Year 5 Parents - Information

The application process for children due to move to secondary school in September 2021 will open on 7th September 2020. Usually West Sussex admissions department send out printed copies of letters to be physically given to every pupil in year 6 in preparation for the secondary transfer to their new school for the September 2021.

From this year onwards this process is going to change and the school will be sent electronic copies of these forms from County and these will then be forwarded onto parents using either Schoolsbuddy or email facility. There are a number of reasons for this change, including a desire to reduce the administration burden on schools, the current Covid-19 pandemic restrictions, as well as varying school start dates for the Autumn term. There is also a leaflet which accompanies this electronic form which will be sent out to parents at the same time. The school website will also be updated to reflect this new procedure when the information has been sent through to the school office.

5. Inset Day Childcare - Thursday 3rd & Friday 4th September 2020



We would like you to write some questions and film an interview with someone who has South Downs Memories.

This does not have to be someone who is very old, nor does it have to be a person who lived in a village (they could have lived in a town but worked or played in the South Downs). The best interviews will the judged by the project manager, Chris Hare.

1st prize - £50

2nd prize - £40

3rd prize - £30

To help you, have a look at our website – <u>www.southdownsgenerations.org.uk</u> – you will find lots of information there that might help you think of questions to ask. As well as prizes, we will also be uploading some of your interviews onto the website.

The closing date for submissions is the 31st August 2020.

Details

- Write some questions that you can ask your interviewee think about asking questions that will let them talk for a while, rather than questions with a 'yes/no' answer. You could ask them about:
- a) Being a child playing in the village/ neighbourhood/ on the downs, either with friends, or more formally with school, scouts, guides etc.
- b) Memories of school days/ family: parents, grandparents, fiends etc.
- c) Did they work in the South Downs and if so what did they do? What was different then from what it would be today?
- d) If the person is old enough, what do they remember about their locality during the Second World War - both from a military and an agriculture point of view? Do they remember any incidents, e.g. bombs being dropped, plane crashing etc.
- e) Ask them, "In what way is life different now than when you were a child? What do you think has changed for the better and what do you think has changed for the worse?"
- Check that your interviewee is happy to be filmed and ask them to fill in the consent form.This consent form is attached. Please return a photo of this to the email address below.
- 3. Film the interview with you behind the camera.
- Ask the interviewee to introduce themselves as soon as you start filming (including their date of birth).
- 5. Take a still photo of the person.
