(These symptoms can last for several weeks.) AND the child feels well.
my child tests negative.	 Contact school to inform us – please use email wherever possible: Office@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk Call if you do not have access to email 01903 204141 Discuss when your child can come back (same day/next day). 	the test comes back negative. AND the child is well enough to attend (children may attend when they are 'under the weather' or Not 100%, in fact, we encourage them to do so to build good habits.
my child is ill with symptoms not linked to Covid-19.	 Child could and should attend when they are under the weather or not 100%. If symptoms are significant and they could not cope with the demands of a school day in the judgement of a parent they should remain away from school. If they possibly could then they should attend. Anyone in your support bubble must also stay at home. 	the child has completed 14 days of isolation.
NHS test and trace has identified my child as a close contact of somebody with symptoms or confirmed Covid-19.	 Do not come to school Contact school to inform us and agree the earliest return date for your child – please use email wherever possible: Office@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk Call if you do not have access to email 01903 204141 Your child's class teacher will contact you to establish learning expectations within two working days, we will create a learning programme that supports your child but it will not be the same as the 'in school' class programme'. my child has travelled abroad from a country or territory that IS in the listed 'travel corridor' countries.	Check status of the country at the time your child was there: https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-travel-corridors If returning from a destination where quarantine is NOT needed contact school to inform us and agree the earliest return date for your child – please use email wherever possible: Office@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk Call if you do not have access to email 01903 204141 	you have informed the office of your return to the UK (the office will ask you a few questions about your travel).
I have travelled from a country that requires us to quarantine (but my child didn't travel).	 If you no member of the household has had symptoms in the last 14 days, your child can continue to attend school. The person who has travelled MUST NOT leave the house, UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES MAY THEY ATTEND SCHOOL Contact school to inform us of the situation and if there are significant difficulties for your child travelling to or from school – please use email wherever possible: Office@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk Call if you do not have access to email 01903 204141 	child can continue to attend school

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What to do if	Action Needed	Return to school when
a child in my child's class has tested positive	 Continue with normal attendance unless directed otherwise We will inform parents if there has been a positive test within the class. This may not require the class bubble to close, a risk assessment will be undertaken to determine 'close contacts' in the classroom – this will be done in conjunction with Public Health representatives. Only when a positive test has been received will action be taken to inform parents whether their child should isolate. We will seek to balance risk of transmission with keeping children learning. A member of the medical team will contact you to inform you if action is needed. 	your child should continue to attend school unless you are informed otherwise.
my child's bubble is closed due to a Covid-19 outbreak in school.	 Child in closed bubble must not come to school. Your child's class teacher will contact you to establish learning expectations within two working days, we will create a learning programme that supports your child but it will not be the same as the 'in school' class programme'. Inform the class teacher if you have any issues accessing appropriate technology e.g. only have access to a mobile phone. Your child will need to self-isolate for 14 days. Other siblings should continue to attend school. 	school inform you that the bubble will be reopened.
