4	Any number less than 6,130 using all 10 counters e.g. 6,121 Any number greater than 6,130 using all 10 counters e.g. 7,030

7	a) 1,750 1,780 2,304 2,600 b) 728 1,322 8,079 8,200
8	Jack has just looked at the size of the first digit and not realised that there are 2 thousands in 2,340 and 0 thousands in 982 so 2,340 must be greater.
