


particularly hard to find my space in the world.

I have many years of experience across military service, work in education at college level and within major construction industry at






Honesty and Integrity.

Every child matters. Every child deserves an education. This statement underpins what I believe and what I did for a career.

I worked as an Engish and Drama secondary school teacher for ten years, and then moved to work as a Special needs teacher.

During my varied twenty year career I was promoted and therefore have both pedagogical and managerial experience to bring to role of Governor.

Helping my pupils to love learning, understand they all had something unique to share and developing their self confidence was my motivation.

I enjoyed being part of the launch of the Gifted and Talented programme which was rolled out in 1997. I also helped to create a book of book reviews with a link primary school. As part of this I wrote to a range of authors, including Jaqueline Wilson and Jean Ure, who wrote a review of their favourite book.

Jean then visited the school and she talked to all the children.

Giving children chances, which don't just 'happen', was really important to me.

That is why I loved the combination of being in charge of KS4 English and Work Experience. I ran an annual careers fair; inviting business leaders to give talks to all of the pupils. Plus I organised a work experience placement for all too.

For this work I helped the school achieve an Investors in Careers award.

Whilst working in special needs I also set up workplace opporunities for all pupils, some outside in businesses and some internally. Some of my special needs pupils continued to work at their placement beyond their work experience block.

The confience and transferrable skills gained from this was something quite brilliant. It was lovely to work closely with the parents and carers on this too.

Another thing I brought into the Special Needs school was a Massage and Medition programme. We are all aware now of the need to be mindful of our mental health and of the mass range of meditation apps now available. I brought this to my school in 2009.

I have a lot to offer as a parent governor, as detailed here. To be able to help with the brilliant work done at Chesswood would be my priviledge.

I am pleased to welcome our new colleagues to the Board and look forward to working with them over the next three years.
