COVID case confirmation – 6RW (Bubble Classes 6MH, 6SJ)

There is no further action for any member of the school community in relation to this case – please read the letter in full if you have concerns

Dear Parent,

We have been made aware of a member of our school community who has tested positive for COVID 19.

We know that you may find this concerning but we are continuing to monitor the situation and are working closely with Public Health England and the Department for Education. This letter is to inform you of the current situation and provide advice on how to support your child. Please be reassured that for most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness. We would ask that families do not contact the school for further information in relation to this unless they are confirming an additional positive test or COVID 19 symptoms as:

- 1. we have contacted all families directly that we believe we need to at this stage
- 2. we are not able to reveal the identity of the case directly or indirectly
- 3. this letter provides a range of information and signposted information on next steps to be taken.
- 4. it will tie up, already stretched resources, within our medical and administration team

The small number of children who have been in close contact with the individual who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) have received a letter informing them that their child must stay at home for 14 days.

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What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19,

- 1. they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test or by calling 119.
- 2. Contact Chesswood Junior school by email immediately you have a positive test result: head@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk and office@chesswood.w-sussex.sch.uk

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home.

If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family. Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.

Household members staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community

If you are able, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period.

Symptoms

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

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- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home



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- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards

Case management principles

- We would not compromise school opening for a wider group of children or staff, therefore ALL
 parents should hold genuine confidence that ALL children and adults that need to isolate, will
 isolate. That will leave a remaining group of children that DO NOT need to isolate and should
 attend school.
- Where there is uncertainty regarding contacts we will be cautious and will close down a class if
 the tracing evidence warrants it. If it doesn't, as in the recent case, we will isolate the appropriate
 number of individuals that have had contact partially closing a class.
- If there is more than one case in a class, the whole class will close with immediate effect. We will then consider the contacts within the wider bubble to determine whether further children should isolate. This will be done in partnership with external agencies including the Depart for Education and Public Health England representatives.
- This is a matter of trust, professional judgement and personal judgment ultimately parents will need to trust that school leaders will undertake their work seriously and diligently in everyone's best interests.
- Please understand that careless talk, speculation and second guessing regarding positive cases
 will lead to significant additional work for school staff already breaking under the strain of the
 current circumstances and will also, when placed on social media, lead to unnecessary worry and
 anxiety at a time when families need less.
- As many understand, we are working with limited resources to address a complex and challenging situation, above and beyond the normal work that is typically under resourced. Despite those challenges we actively want families to contact us immediately, if you believe
 - o we have overlooked something and you have reasonable evidence that is the case
 - you have additional information that could reasonably support a review of the current decisions that have been made
 - you have exceptional circumstances that affect your family and need to be considered in more depth between home and school e.g. living with a person (adult or child) that is extremely clinically vulnerable
- Otherwise we would politely ask families to avoid seeking further information regarding any
 confirmed case. Please help us help the whole of our very diverse school community navigate
 through these challenging times in the most effective way possible.
