NASTY WRITING!

Using the passive voice

First things first, what is it?!

Can you tell an adult at home what it is and how we use it? (I bet they might not know....)

If you can't remember, don't worry:

Out of the blue, a pigeon appeared and tried to grab his bagel!

(ACTIVE voice – the pigeon is the subject and is doing the actions)

(This is what we use most of the time when we are speaking or writing informally)

All of a sudden, his delicious-looking cinnamon bagel was snatched out of his hands.

(PASSIVE voice – the bagel is the focus of the sentence, but it is not doing the snatching!)

REMEMBER: if you can insert 'by zombies' at the end of the sentence, the sentence is in the PASSIVE voice!

Eg All of a sudden, his delicious-looking cinnamon bagel <u>was snatched</u> out of his hands (*by zombies* – or in this case, by a hungry pigeon!)
