Our vocabulary for this unit:

★ **Lettering** – letters written or printed on something else. ★

Typography – the style and appearance of printed matter.

★ **Calligraphy** – decorative handwriting or lettering (usually with a pen or brush) ★

Represent – showing a viewpoint or action or speech of someone else in a new context.

Street art – artwork created in a public space, typically without official permission.

★ **Stencil** – a thin sheet of material with a pattern or letters cut out of it, used to produce the cut design on the surface below by the application of ink or paint through the holes. ★

Social media – websites and applications that enable users to create and share content or to participate in social networking.

Climate change – a change in global or regional climate patterns.

Graffiti Debate WALT: understand what Art may represent.



For Graffiti

Graffiti can show messages
 Graffiti can be art
 A way for people to share their feelings and ideas freely
 It can help to improve the look of an area
 Kids are having fun and they're not causing any other trouble on the streets
 Before graffiti artists, streets were grey, dull, boring and bland places to be. We need to stop neglecting them of some colour
 The town looks a lot more attractive because of the graffiti
 Museums and art galleries are now considering graffiti as art and placing it in their own buildings
 Graffiti attracts locals and tourists from around the world
 Spray cans are cheaper than using paints on canvas
 We paint on walls so that we don't waste paper. Our art means that we are 'green' and don't harm our planet



Against Graffiti

Waste of money cleaning up
 Waste of important police time cleaning it up
 We could be spending council money on more important projects
 Affects shop owners who have to clean their properties
 Money to clean it up comes out of our pockets
 More graffiti means fewer customers in shops or to an area. Fewer customers mean less income/salary/wage
 Has ruined walls, play equipment and trees in the park so children are too scared to go
 The so-called 'artists' should be fined to pay for the damage
 The streets are fine the way they are- we don't need any colour to brighten them up
 We want to keep the streets clean and green and free of mess
 Graffiti is pollution (visual). The sprays also give off toxic fumes (gas)
 Why should it be up to teenagers and kids to decide what our streets look like?
 Every time you graffiti, it is still illegal so these vandals may as well stop.
 Bad influence on children, who may pick up a bad habit or see something inappropriate
 Surely it makes more sense to paint on canvas. Then you can actually sell your work
 for money
 Graffiti has destroyed road signs and made it confusing for road users to follow

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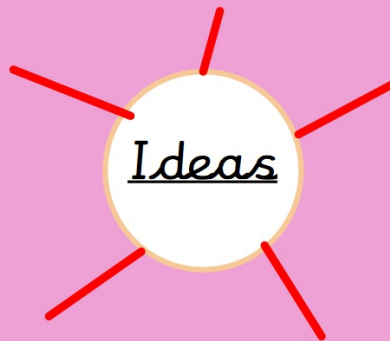

BANKSY

Banksy

Banksy - who is 47 - is an anonymous (meaning we don't know who he is or what his real name is) England based street artist who has been creating Art since the 1990s.

Born: Bristol ★

Inspiration: Often music.

Writing: Banksy wrote a book which displays all his work and his ★ thoughts and ideas behind his Artwork. The book is called 'Wall and Piece'. Does anyone recognise a Classic book which sounds similar?

Artistic development: Upon starting his career, his work was created free hand and developed into using ★ stencils for greater effects.

Inspiration: Blek De Rat and Jef Areosol (both French Street Artists)

Awards and success: Banksy, in 2007, won the Art's Greatest Living Briton award but he didn't go in person to collect the award as he wishes to keep his identity a secret.

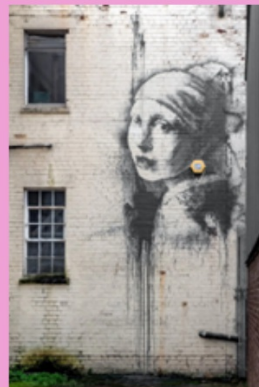

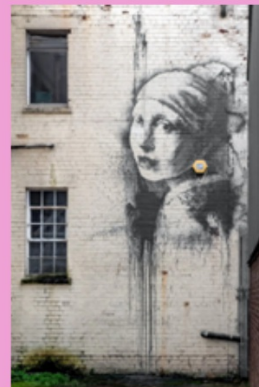
